## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Energy Conservation and Coal Development Act
  is amended by changing Section 8 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 1105/8) (from Ch. 96 1/2, par. 7408)

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Sec. 8. Illinois Coal Development Board.

8 (a) There may be established as an advisory board to the 9 Department, the Illinois Coal Development Board, hereinafter in this Section called the Board. The Board shall be composed 10 11 of the following voting members: the Director of the 12 Department, who shall be Chairman thereof; the Deputy Director of the Bureau of Business Development within the Department of 13 14 Commerce and Economic Opportunity; the President of the University of Illinois or his or her designee; the Director of 15 16 Natural Resources or that Director's designee; the Director of 17 the Office of Mines and Minerals within the Department of Natural Resources; 4 members of the General Assembly (one each 18 19 appointed by the President of the Senate, the Senate Minority Leader, the Speaker of the House, and the House Minority 20 21 Leader); and 8 persons appointed by the Governor, with the 22 advice and consent of the Senate, including representatives of Illinois industries that are involved in the extraction, 23

Illinois coal, persons 1 utilization or transportation of 2 representing financial or banking interests in the State, and 3 persons experienced in international business and economic development. These members shall be chosen from persons of 4 5 recognized ability and experience in their designated field. 6 The members appointed by the Governor shall serve for terms of 4 years, unless otherwise provided in this subsection. The 7 8 initial terms of the original appointees shall expire on July 9 1, 1985, except that the Governor shall designate 3 of the 10 original appointees to serve initial terms that shall expire on 11 July 1, 1983. The initial term of the member appointed by the 12 Governor to fill the office created after July 1, 1985 shall expire on July 1, 1989. The initial terms of the members 13 appointed by the Governor to fill the offices created by this 14 15 amendatory Act of 1993 shall expire on July 1, 1995, and July 16 1, 1997, as determined by the Governor. A member appointed by a 17 Legislative Leader shall serve for the duration of the General Assembly for which he or she is appointed, so long as the 18 member remains a member of that General Assembly. 19

The Board may meet at least annually or at the call of the Chairman. At any time the majority of the Board may petition the Chairman for a meeting of the Board. Nine members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. Members of the Board shall be reimbursed for actual and necessary expenses incurred while performing their duties as members of the Board from funds appropriated to the Department for such purpose. 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(b) The Board shall provide advice and make recommendations on the following Department powers and duties:

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3 (1) To develop an annual agenda which may include but is not limited to research and methodologies conducted for 4 5 the purpose of increasing the utilization of Illinois' coal and other fossil fuel resources, with emphasis on high 6 7 sulfur coal, in the following areas: coal extraction, 8 characterization; coal preparation and technologies 9 (combustion, gasification, liquefaction, and related processes); marketing; public awareness and education, as 10 11 those terms are used in the Illinois Coal Technology 12 Development Assistance Act; transportation; procurement of sites and issuance of permits; and environmental impacts. 13

14 (2) To support and coordinate Illinois coal research,
15 and to approve projects consistent with the annual agenda
16 and budget for coal research and the purposes of this Act
17 and to approve the annual budget and operating plan for
18 administration of the Board.

19 (3) To promote the coordination of available research 20 information on the production, preparation, distribution 21 and uses of Illinois coal. The Board shall advise the 22 existing research institutions within the State on areas 23 where research may be necessary.

(4) To cooperate to the fullest extent possible with
 State and federal agencies and departments, independent
 organizations, and other interested groups, public and

private, for the purposes of promoting Illinois coal
 resources.

3 (5) To submit an annual report to the Governor and the Assembly outlining the 4 General progress and 5 accomplishments made in the year, providing an accounting of funds received and disbursed, reviewing the status of 6 7 research contracts, and furnishing other relevant 8 information.

9 (6) To focus on existing coal research efforts in 10 carrying out its mission; to make use of existing research 11 facilities in Illinois or other institutions carrying out 12 research on Illinois coal; as far as practicable, to make maximum use of the research facilities available at the 13 14 Illinois State Geological Survey of the University of 15 Illinois, the Coal Extraction and Utilization Research 16 Center, the Illinois Coal Development Park and 17 universities and colleges located within the State of Illinois: and to create a consortium or center which 18 19 conducts, coordinates and supports coal research 20 activities in the State of Illinois. Programmatic 21 activities of such a consortium or center shall be subject 22 to approval by the Department and shall be consistent with 23 the purposes of this Act. The Department may authorize 24 expenditure of funds in support of the administrative and 25 programmatic operations of such a center or consortium 26 consistent with its statutory authority. 1 2 actions undertaken by or for such a center or consortium shall be subject to the approval of the Department.

(7) To make a reasonable attempt, before initiating any
research under this Act, to avoid duplication of effort and
expense by coordinating the research efforts among various
agencies, departments, universities or organizations, as
the case may be.

8 (8) To adopt, amend and repeal rules, regulations and 9 bylaws governing the Board's organization and conduct of 10 business.

(9) To authorize the expenditure of monies from the Coal Technology Development Assistance Fund, the Public Utility Fund and other funds in the State Treasury appropriated to the Department, consistent with the purposes of this Act.

16 (10) To seek, accept, and expend gifts or grants in any 17 form, from any public agency or from any other source. Such 18 gifts and grants may be held in trust by the Department and 19 expended at the direction of the Department and in the 20 exercise of the Department's powers and performance of the 21 Department's duties.

(11) To publish, from time to time, the results of
Illinois coal research projects funded through the
Department.

(12) To authorize loans from appropriations from the
 Build Illinois Bond Purposes Fund, the Build Illinois Bond

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Fund and the Illinois Industrial Coal Utilization Fund.

2 (13) To authorize expenditures of monies for coal
3 development projects under the authority of Section 13 of
4 the General Obligation Bond Act.

5 (c) The Board shall also provide advice and make 6 recommendations on the following Department powers and duties:

7 (1) To create and maintain thorough, current and 8 accurate records on all markets for and actual uses of coal 9 mined in Illinois, and to make such records available to 10 the public upon request.

11 (2) To identify all current and anticipated future 12 technical, economic, institutional, market, environmental, 13 regulatory and other impediments to the utilization of 14 Illinois coal.

15 (3) To monitor and evaluate all proposals and plans of 16 public utilities related to compliance with the 17 requirements of Title IV of the federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990, or with any other law which might 18 19 affect the use of Illinois coal, for the purposes of (i) 20 determining the effects of such proposals or plans on the use of Illinois coal, and (ii) identifying alternative 21 22 plans or actions which would maintain or increase the use 23 of Illinois coal.

(4) To develop strategies and to propose policies to
 promote environmentally responsible uses of Illinois coal
 for meeting electric power supply requirements and for

5 Section 10. The Illinois Coal Technology Development 6 Assistance Act is amended by changing Sections 2 and 5 as 7 follows:

9 Sec. 2. As used in this Act:

10 (a) "coal" or "coal resources" means Illinois coal or coal 11 products extracted from the ground or reclaimed from the waste 12 material produced by coal extraction operations;

(b) "coal demonstration and commercialization" means projects for the construction and operation of facilities to prove the scientific and engineering validity or the commercial application of a coal extraction, preparation, combustion, gasification, liquefaction or other synthetic process, environmental control, or transportation method;

"coal research" means scientific investigations 19 (C) 20 conducted for the purpose of increasing the utilization of coal 21 and includes investigations in the areas resources of 22 extraction, preparation, characterization, combustion, gasification, liquefaction and other synthetic processes, 23 24 environmental control, marketing, transportation, procurement HB5660 Engrossed - 8 - LRB098 17981 MGM 53106 b

of sites, and environmental impacts; 1 2 "Fund" means the Coal (d) Technology Development 3 Assistance Fund; (e) "Board" means the Illinois Coal Development Board or 4 5 its successor; 6 (f) "Department" means the Department of Commerce and 7 Economic Opportunity; 8 (blank). "public awareness and education" means (q) 9 programs of education, curriculum development, public service 10 announcements, informational advertising and informing the 11 news media on issues related to the use of Illinois coal, the 12 coal industry and related developments. 4 (c) To make a reasonable attempt, before initiating any 5 projects under this Act, to avoid duplication of support for 6 previous or ongoing activities, or projects that would be more 7 appropriately funded under the Illinois Coal and Energy 8 Development Bond Act.

9 (d) To seek, accept and expend gifts or grants in any form, 10 from any public agency or any other source, for the purposes of 11 this Act.

12 (e) To adopt, amend and repeal rules, regulations and13 guidelines to implement and administer this Act.
