

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The following named amounts, or so much
6 thereof as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects
7 and purposes hereinafter named, are appropriated to the Board
8 of Trustees of Chicago State University to meet ordinary and
9 contingent expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2015:

10 Payable from the Education Assistance Fund:

11	For Personal Services, including payment	
12	to the university for personal services	
13	costs incurred during the fiscal year	
14	and salaries accrued but unpaid to academic	
15	personnel for personal services rendered	
16	during the academic year 2014-2015	35,595,000
17	For State Contributions to Social	
18	Security, for Medicare	0
19	For Group Insurance	1,024,000
20	For Contractual Services	0

7 Section 10. The sum of \$500,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Education
9 Assistance Fund to the Board of Trustees of Chicago State
10 University as a grant to the Financial Assistance Outreach
11 Center.

12 Section 15. The sum of \$1,600,000, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Chicago State
14 University Education Improvement Fund to the Board of
15 Trustees of Chicago State University for any expenses
16 incurred by the university.

17 Section 20. The sum of \$307,000, or so much thereof as
18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General
19 Professions Dedicated Fund to the Board of Trustees of
20 Chicago State University for costs associated with the
21 development, support or administration of pharmacy practice
22 education or training programs.
