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1	AMENDMENT TO SENATE BILL 1354
2	AMENDMENT NO Amend Senate Bill 1354, AS AMENDED,
3	by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the
4	following:
5	"Section 5. The Illinois Horse Racing Act of 1975 is
6	amended by adding Section 12.2 as follows:
7	(230 ILCS 5/12.2 new)
8	Sec. 12.2. Business enterprise program.
9	(a) For the purposes of this Section, the terms "minority",
10	"minority owned business", "female", "female owned business",
11	"person with a disability", and "business owned by a person
12	with a disability" have the meaning ascribed to them in the
13	Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with
14	Disabilities Act.
15	(b) The Board shall, by rule, establish goals for the award
16	of contracts by each organization licensee or inter-track

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1 wagering licensee to businesses owned by minorities, females, and persons with disabilities, expressed as percentages of an 2 organization licensee's or inter-track wagering licensee's 3 4 total dollar amount of contracts awarded during each calendar 5 year. Each organization licensee or inter-track wagering licensee must make every effort to meet the goals established 6 by the Board pursuant to this Section. When setting the goals 7 for the award of contracts, the Board shall not include 8 9 contracts where: (1) licensees are purchasing goods or services 10 from vendors or suppliers or in markets where there are no or a 11 limited number of minority owned businesses, women owned businesses, or businesses owned by persons with disabilities 12 13 that would be sufficient to satisfy the goal; (2) there are no 14 or a limited number of suppliers licensed by the Board; (3) the 15 licensee or its parent company owns a company that provides the 16 goods or services; or (4) the goods or services are provided to the licensee by a publicly traded company. 17

(c) Each organization licensee or inter-track wagering 18 19 licensee shall file with the Board an annual report of its 20 utilization of minority owned businesses, female owned 21 businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities 22 during the preceding calendar year. The reports shall include a self-evaluation of the efforts of the organization licensee or 23 24 inter-track wagering licensee to meet its goals under this 25 Section.

26 (d) The organization licensee or inter-track wagering

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1 licensee shall have the right to request a waiver from the requirements of this Section. The Board shall grant the waiver 2 where the organization licensee or inter-track wagering 3 4 licensee demonstrates that there has been made a good faith 5 effort to comply with the goals for participation by minority owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 6 7 owned by persons with disabilities. 8 (e) If the Board determines that its goals and policies are 9 not being met by any organization licensee or inter-track 10 wagering licensee, then the Board may: 11 (1) adopt remedies for such violations; and (2) recommend that the organization licensee or 12 13 inter-track wagering licensee provide additional 14 opportunities for participation by minority owned 15 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities; such recommendations may 16 17 include, but shall not be limited to: (A) assurances of stronger and better focused 18 19 solicitation efforts to obtain more minority owned 20 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 21 owned by persons with disabilities as potential 22 sources of supply; 23 (B) division of job or project requirements, when 24 economically feasible, into tasks or quantities to 25 permit participation of minority owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned by 26

1	persons with disabilities;
2	(C) elimination of extended experience or
3	capitalization requirements, when programmatically
4	feasible, to permit participation of minority owned
5	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses
6	owned by persons with disabilities;
7	(D) identification of specific proposed contracts
8	as particularly attractive or appropriate for
9	participation by minority owned businesses, female
10	owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with
11	disabilities, such identification to result from and
12	be coupled with the efforts of items (A) through (C);
13	and
14	(E) implementation of regulations established for
15	the use of the sheltered market process.
16	(f) The Board shall file, no later than March 1 of each
17	year, an annual report that shall detail the level of
18	achievement toward the goals specified in this Section over the
19	3 most recent fiscal years. The annual report shall include,
20	but need not be limited to:
21	(1) a summary detailing expenditures subject to the
22	goals, the actual goals specified, and the goals attained
23	by each organization licensee or inter-track wagering
24	licensee;
25	(2) a summary of the number of contracts awarded and
26	the average contract amount by each organization licensee

1	or inter-track wagering licensee;
2	(3) an analysis of the level of overall goal
3	achievement concerning purchases from minority owned
4	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned
5	by persons with disabilities;
6	(4) an analysis of the number of minority owned
7	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned
8	by persons with disabilities that are certified under the
9	program as well as the number of those businesses that
10	received State procurement contracts; and
11	(5) a summary of the number of contracts awarded to
12	businesses with annual gross sales of less than \$1,000,000;
13	of \$1,000,000 or more, but less than \$5,000,000; of
14	\$5,000,000 or more, but less than \$10,000,000; and of
15	\$10,000,000 or more.
16	Section 10. The Riverboat Gambling Act is amended by adding
17	Section 7.6 as follows:
18	(230 ILCS 10/7.6 new)
19	Sec. 7.6. Business enterprise program.
20	(a) For the purposes of this Section, the terms "minority",
21	"minority owned business", "female", "female owned business",
22	"person with a disability", and "business owned by a person
23	with a disability" have the meaning ascribed to them in the
24	Business Enterprise for Minorities, Females, and Persons with

1 <u>Disabilities Act.</u>

(b) The Board shall, by rule, establish goals for the award 2 of contracts by each owners licensee to businesses owned by 3 4 minorities, females, and persons with disabilities, expressed 5 as percentages of an owners licensee's total dollar amount of 6 contracts awarded during each calendar year. Each owners licensee must make every effort to meet the goals established 7 by the Board pursuant to this Section. When setting the goals 8 9 for the award of contracts, the Board shall not include 10 contracts where: (1) any purchasing mandates would be dependent 11 upon the availability of minority owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with 12 13 disabilities ready, willing, and able with capacity to provide 14 quality goods and services to a gaming operation at reasonable 15 prices; (2) there are no or a limited number of licensed 16 suppliers as defined by this Act for the goods or services provided to the licensee; (3) the licensee or its parent 17 company owns a company that provides the goods or services; or 18 19 (4) the goods or services are provided to the licensee by a 20 publicly traded company.

(c) Each owners licensee shall file with the Board an annual report of its utilization of minority owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with disabilities during the preceding calendar year. The reports shall include a self-evaluation of the efforts of the owners licensee to meet its goals under this Section. 09800SB1354sam003

1	(d) The owners licensee shall have the right to request a
2	waiver from the requirements of this Section. The Board shall
3	grant the waiver where the owners licensee demonstrates that
4	there has been made a good faith effort to comply with the
5	goals for participation by minority owned businesses, female
6	owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with
7	disabilities.
8	(e) If the Board determines that its goals and policies are
9	not being met by any owners licensee, then the Board may:
10	(1) adopt remedies for such violations; and
11	(2) recommend that the owners licensee provide
12	additional opportunities for participation by minority
13	owned businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses
14	owned by persons with disabilities; such recommendations
15	may include, but shall not be limited to:
16	(A) assurances of stronger and better focused
17	solicitation efforts to obtain more minority owned
18	businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses
19	owned by persons with disabilities as potential
20	sources of supply;
21	(B) division of job or project requirements, when
22	economically feasible, into tasks or quantities to
23	permit participation of minority owned businesses,
24	female owned businesses, and businesses owned by
25	persons with disabilities;
26	(C) elimination of extended experience or

capitalization requirements, when programmatically 1 2 feasible, to permit participation of minority owned 3 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses 4 owned by persons with disabilities; 5 (D) identification of specific proposed contracts as particularly attractive or appropriate for 6 participation by minority owned businesses, female 7 8 owned businesses, and businesses owned by persons with 9 disabilities, such identification to result from and 10 be coupled with the efforts of items (A) through (C); 11 and (E) implementation of regulations established for 12 13 the use of the sheltered market process. (f) The Board shall file, no later than March 1 of each 14 15 year, an annual report that shall detail the level of achievement toward the goals specified in this Section over the 16 3 most recent fiscal years. The annual report shall include, 17 but need not be limited to: 18 19 (1) a summary detailing expenditures subject to the 20 goals, the actual goals specified, and the goals attained 21 by each owners licensee; and 22 (2) an analysis of the level of overall goal achievement concerning purchases from minority owned 23 24 businesses, female owned businesses, and businesses owned 25 by persons with disabilities.

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Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
becoming law.".
