SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

40 ILCS 5/24-105.1

Amends the Deferred Compensation Article of the Illinois Pension Code. Provides that to the extent that federal law or regulations have been changed to allow plans established under Section 457 of the Internal Revenue Code to be amended to allow designated Roth contributions and in-plan rollovers to designated Roth accounts, the Department of Central Management Services and units of local government with such plans shall within a reasonable time amend their plans accordingly.

- 7 Sec. 24-105.1. Changes in federal law.
- (a) To the extent that federal law or regulations which 8 9 require a governmental employer to own the assets of its 10 deferred compensation plan are changed to allow plans 11 established under Section 457 of the Internal Revenue Code to hold their assets in trust, a custodial account, an annuity 12 contract, an insurance contract or some other contract, the 13 14 Department of Central Management Services and units of local government with plans established under Section 24-107 shall 15 16 within a reasonable time amend their plans accordingly.
 - (b) To the extent that federal law or regulations have been changed to allow plans established under Section 457 of the Internal Revenue Code to be amended to allow designated Roth contributions and in-plan rollovers to designated Roth accounts, the Department of Central Management Services and units of local government with plans established under Section 24-107 shall within a reasonable time amend their plans
