SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

15 ILCS 335/4	from Ch. 124, par. 24
15 ILCS 335/5	from Ch. 124, par. 25
625 ILCS 5/6-106	from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-106

Amends the Illinois Identification Card Act. Allows peace officers to provide their work address in lieu of their home address when applying for an Illinois Identification Card. Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. Allows peace officers to provide their work address in lieu of their home address when applying for a driver's license or instruction permit.

AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Identification Card Act is amended
 by changing Sections 4 and 5 as follows:
- 6 (15 ILCS 335/4) (from Ch. 124, par. 24)
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Sec. 4. Identification Card.

(a) The Secretary of State shall issue a standard Illinois 8 9 Identification Card to any natural person who is a resident of the State of Illinois who applies for such card, or renewal 10 thereof, or who applies for a standard Illinois Identification 11 12 Card upon release as a committed person on parole, mandatory 13 supervised release, final discharge, or pardon from the 14 Department of Corrections by submitting an identification card issued by the Department of Corrections under Section 3-14-1 of 15 the Unified Code of Corrections, together with the prescribed 16 17 fees. No identification card shall be issued to any person who holds a valid foreign state identification card, license, or 18 19 permit unless the person first surrenders to the Secretary of 20 State the valid foreign state identification card, license, or 21 permit. The card shall be prepared and supplied by the 22 Secretary of State and shall include a photograph and signature or mark of the applicant. However, the Secretary of State may 23

provide by rule for the issuance of Illinois Identification 1 2 Cards without photographs if the applicant has a bona fide 3 religious objection to being photographed or to the display of his or her photograph. The Illinois Identification Card may be 4 5 used for identification purposes in any lawful situation only by the person to whom it was issued. As used in this Act, 6 7 "photograph" means any color photograph or digitally produced 8 and captured image of an applicant for an identification card. 9 As used in this Act, "signature" means the name of a person as written by that person and captured in a manner acceptable to 10 11 the Secretary of State.

12 (a-5) If an applicant for an identification card has a 13 current driver's license or instruction permit issued by the 14 Secretary of State, the Secretary may require the applicant to 15 utilize the same residence address and name on the 16 identification card, driver's license, and instruction permit 17 records maintained by the Secretary. The Secretary may promulgate rules to implement this provision. 18

19 (a-10) If the applicant is a judicial officer as defined in 20 Section 1-10 of the Judicial Privacy Act <u>or a peace officer</u>, 21 the applicant may elect to have his or her office or work 22 address listed on the card instead of the applicant's residence 23 or mailing address. The Secretary may promulgate rules to 24 implement this provision.

(b) The Secretary of State shall issue a special Illinois
Identification Card, which shall be known as an Illinois Person

with a Disability Identification Card, to any natural person 1 2 who is a resident of the State of Illinois, who is a person with a disability as defined in Section 4A of this Act, who 3 applies for such card, or renewal thereof. No Illinois Person 4 5 with a Disability Identification Card shall be issued to any person who holds a valid foreign state identification card, 6 7 license, or permit unless the person first surrenders to the Secretary of State the valid foreign state identification card, 8 9 license, or permit. The Secretary of State shall charge no fee 10 to issue such card. The card shall be prepared and supplied by 11 the Secretary of State, and shall include a photograph and 12 signature or mark of the applicant, a designation indicating 13 that the card is an Illinois Person with a Disability 14 Identification Card, and shall include a comprehensible 15 designation of the type and classification of the applicant's 16 disability as set out in Section 4A of this Act. However, the 17 Secretary of State may provide by rule for the issuance of Illinois **Disabled** Person with a Disability Identification 18 19 Cards without photographs if the applicant has a bona fide 20 religious objection to being photographed or to the display of his or her photograph. If the applicant so requests, the card 21 22 shall include a description of the applicant's disability and 23 any information about the applicant's disability or medical history which the Secretary determines would be helpful to the 24 25 applicant in securing emergency medical care. If a mark is used 26 in lieu of a signature, such mark shall be affixed to the card

in the presence of two witnesses who attest to the authenticity 1 2 the Disability of mark. The Illinois Person with а 3 Identification Card may be used for identification purposes in any lawful situation by the person to whom it was issued. 4

5 The Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card may be used as adequate documentation of disability in lieu of 6 7 a physician's determination of disability, a determination of 8 disability from a physician assistant who has been delegated 9 the authority to make this determination by his or her 10 supervising physician, a determination of disability from an 11 advanced practice nurse who has a written collaborative 12 agreement with a collaborating physician that authorizes the 13 advanced practice nurse to make this determination, or any other documentation of disability whenever any State law 14 15 requires that a disabled person provide such documentation of 16 disability, however an Illinois Person with a Disability 17 Identification Card shall not qualify the cardholder to participate in any program or to receive any benefit which is 18 19 not available to all persons with like disabilities. 20 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card, or evidence that the 21 22 Secretary of State has issued an Illinois Person with a 23 Disability Identification Card, shall not be used by any person 24 other than the person named on such card to prove that the 25 person named on such card is a disabled person or for any other 26 purpose unless the card is used for the benefit of the person

named on such card, and the person named on such card consents
 to such use at the time the card is so used.

An optometrist's determination of a visual disability under Section 4A of this Act is acceptable as documentation for the purpose of issuing an Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card.

7 When medical information is contained on an Illinois Person 8 with a Disability Identification Card, the Office of the 9 Secretary of State shall not be liable for any actions taken 10 based upon that medical information.

11 (c) The Secretary of State shall provide that each original 12 or renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card issued to a person under the 13 age of 21_{τ} shall be of a distinct nature from those Illinois 14 Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a Disability 15 16 Identification Cards issued to individuals 21 years of age or 17 older. The color designated for Illinois Identification Cards or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Cards for 18 19 persons under the age of 21 shall be at the discretion of the 20 Secretary of State.

(c-1) Each original or renewal Illinois Identification Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card issued to a person under the age of 21 shall display the date upon which the person becomes 18 years of age and the date upon which the person becomes 21 years of age.

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(c-3) The General Assembly recognizes the need to identify

military veterans living in this State for the purpose of 1 2 ensuring that they receive all of the services and benefits to 3 which they are legally entitled, including healthcare, education assistance, and job placement. To assist the State in 4 5 identifying these veterans and delivering these vital services 6 and benefits, the Secretary of State is authorized to issue 7 Illinois Identification Cards and Illinois Disabled Person with a Disability Identification Cards with the word "veteran" 8 9 appearing on the face of the cards. This authorization is 10 predicated on the unique status of veterans. The Secretary may 11 not issue any other identification card which identifies an 12 occupation, status, affiliation, hobby, or other unique 13 characteristics of the identification card holder which is 14 unrelated to the purpose of the identification card.

15 (c-5) Beginning on or before July 1, 2015, the Secretary of 16 State shall designate a space on each original or renewal 17 identification card where, at the request of the applicant, the 18 word "veteran" shall be placed. The veteran designation shall 19 be available to a person identified as a veteran under 20 subsection (b) of Section 5 of this Act who was discharged or 21 separated under honorable conditions.

(d) The Secretary of State may issue a Senior Citizen discount card, to any natural person who is a resident of the State of Illinois who is 60 years of age or older and who applies for such a card or renewal thereof. The Secretary of State shall charge no fee to issue such card. The card shall be

issued in every county and applications shall be made available at, but not limited to, nutrition sites, senior citizen centers and Area Agencies on Aging. The applicant, upon receipt of such card and prior to its use for any purpose, shall have affixed thereon in the space provided therefor his signature or mark.

6 (e) The Secretary of State, in his or her discretion, may 7 designate on each Illinois Identification Card or Illinois 8 Person with a Disability Identification Card a space where the 9 card holder may place a sticker or decal, issued by the 10 Secretary of State, of uniform size as the Secretary may 11 specify, that shall indicate in appropriate language that the 12 card holder has renewed his or her Illinois Identification Card or Illinois Person with a Disability Identification Card. 13

- 19 Sec. 5. Applications.

(a) Any natural person who is a resident of the State of
Illinois, may file an application for an identification card,
or for the renewal thereof, in a manner prescribed by the
Secretary. Each original application shall be completed by the
applicant in full and shall set forth the legal name, residence
address and zip code, social security number, birth date, sex

and a brief description of the applicant. The applicant shall 1 2 be photographed, unless the Secretary of State has provided by 3 for the issuance of identification cards without rule photographs and the applicant is deemed eligible for an 4 5 identification card without a photograph under the terms and 6 conditions imposed by the Secretary of State, and he or she 7 shall also submit any other information as the Secretary may 8 deem necessary or such documentation as the Secretary may 9 require to determine the identity of the applicant. In addition 10 to the residence address, the Secretary may allow the applicant 11 to provide a mailing address. If the applicant is a judicial 12 officer as defined in Section 1-10 of the Judicial Privacy Act or a peace officer, the applicant may elect to have his or her 13 office or work address in lieu of the applicant's residence or 14 15 mailing address. An applicant for an Illinois Person with a 16 Disability Identification Card must also submit with each 17 original or renewal application, on forms prescribed by the Secretary, such documentation as the Secretary may require, 18 19 establishing that the applicant is a "person with a disability" 20 as defined in Section 4A of this Act, and setting forth the applicant's type and class of disability as set forth in 21 22 Section 4A of this Act.

(b) Beginning on or before July 1, 2015, for each original or renewal identification card application under this Act, the Secretary shall inquire as to whether the applicant is a veteran for purposes of issuing an identification card with a veteran designation under subsection (c-5) of Section 4 of this Act. The acceptable forms of proof shall include, but are not limited to, Department of Defense form DD-214. The Secretary shall determine by rule what other forms of proof of a person's status as a veteran are acceptable.

6 The Illinois Department of Veterans' Affairs shall confirm 7 the status of the applicant as an honorably discharged veteran 8 before the Secretary may issue the identification card.

For purposes of this subsection (b):

10 "Active duty" means active duty under an executive order of 11 the President of the United States, an Act of the Congress of 12 the United States, or an order of the Governor.

13 "Armed forces" means any of the Armed Forces of the United 14 States, including a member of any reserve component or National 15 Guard unit called to active duty.

16 "Veteran" means a person who has served on active duty in 17 the armed forces and was discharged or separated under 18 honorable conditions.

22 Section 10. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 23 changing Section 6-106 as follows:

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(625 ILCS 5/6-106) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-106)

Sec. 6-106. Application for license or instruction permit.

(a) Every application for any permit or license authorized
to be issued under this Act shall be made upon a form furnished
by the Secretary of State. Every application shall be
accompanied by the proper fee and payment of such fee shall
entitle the applicant to not more than 3 attempts to pass the
examination within a period of 1 year after the date of
application.

9 (b) Every application shall state the legal name, social 10 security number, zip code, date of birth, sex, and residence 11 address of the applicant; briefly describe the applicant; state 12 whether the applicant has theretofore been licensed as a driver, and, if so, when and by what state or country, and 13 14 whether any such license has ever been cancelled, suspended, 15 revoked or refused, and, if so, the date and reason for such 16 cancellation, suspension, revocation or refusal; shall include 17 an affirmation by the applicant that all information set forth is true and correct; and shall bear the applicant's signature. 18 19 In addition to the residence address, the Secretary may allow 20 the applicant to provide a mailing address. In the case of an applicant who is a judicial officer or peace officer, the 21 22 Secretary may allow the applicant to provide an office or work 23 in lieu of a residence or mailing address. address The application form may also require the statement of such 24 25 additional relevant information as the Secretary of State shall 26 deem necessary to determine the applicant's competency and

eligibility. The Secretary of State may, in his discretion, by 1 2 rule or regulation, provide that an application for a drivers license or permit may include a suitable photograph of the 3 applicant in the form prescribed by the Secretary, and he may 4 5 further provide that each drivers license shall include a photograph of the driver. The Secretary of State may utilize a 6 photograph process or system most suitable to deter alteration 7 8 or improper reproduction of a drivers license and to prevent 9 substitution of another photo thereon.

10 (c) The application form shall include a notice to the 11 applicant of the registration obligations of sex offenders 12 under the Sex Offender Registration Act. The notice shall be 13 provided in a form and manner prescribed by the Secretary of 14 State. For purposes of this subsection (c), "sex offender" has 15 the meaning ascribed to it in Section 2 of the Sex Offender 16 Registration Act.

17 (d) Any male United States citizen or immigrant who applies for any permit or license authorized to be issued under this 18 19 Act or for a renewal of any permit or license, and who is at least 18 years of age but less than 26 years of age, must be 20 registered in compliance with the requirements of the federal 21 22 Military Selective Service Act. The Secretary of State must 23 an electronic format the necessary personal forward in information regarding the applicants identified 24 in this 25 subsection (d) to the Selective Service System. The applicant's 26 signature on the application serves as an indication that the

applicant either has already registered with the Selective Service System or that he is authorizing the Secretary to forward to the Selective Service System the necessary information for registration. The Secretary must notify the applicant at the time of application that his signature constitutes consent to registration with the Selective Service System, if he is not already registered.

8 (e) Beginning on or before July 1, 2015, for each original 9 or renewal driver's license application under this Act, the 10 Secretary shall inquire as to whether the applicant is a veteran for purposes of issuing a driver's license with a 11 12 veteran designation under subsection (e-5) of Section 6-110 of 13 this Chapter. The acceptable forms of proof shall include, but are not limited to, Department of Defense form DD-214. The 14 15 Secretary shall determine by rule what other forms of proof of 16 a person's status as a veteran are acceptable.

17 The Illinois Department of Veterans' Affairs shall confirm 18 the status of the applicant as an honorably discharged veteran 19 before the Secretary may issue the driver's license.

20 For purposes of this subsection (e):

21 "Active duty" means active duty under an executive order of 22 the President of the United States, an Act of the Congress of 23 the United States, or an order of the Governor.

24 "Armed forces" means any of the Armed Forces of the United 25 States, including a member of any reserve component or National 26 Guard unit called to active duty.
