## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

625 ILCS 5/11-1301.1	from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1301.1
625 ILCS 5/11-1301.2	from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1301.2

Amends the Illinois Vehicle Code. In Section on special decals for parking and persons with disabilities, revises cross-reference to the definition of "persons with disabilities" with respect to a temporary disability. Provides that exemptions from parking fees for disabled persons shall only apply to metered street parking and not to public parking structures or areas. Requires an application for a meter exempt decal to provide evidence of permanent disability.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by changing
Sections 11-1301.1 and 11-1301.2 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/11-1301.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 11-1301.1)

Sec. 11-1301.1. Persons with disabilities - Parking
privileges - Exemptions.

9 (a) A motor vehicle bearing registration plates issued to a person with disabilities, as defined by Section 1-159.1, 10 pursuant to Section 3-616 or to a disabled veteran pursuant to 11 subsection (a) of Section 3-609 or a special decal or device 12 issued pursuant to Section 3-616 or pursuant to Section 13 14 11-1301.2 of this Code or a motor vehicle registered in another jurisdiction, state, district, territory or foreign country 15 16 upon which is displayed a registration plate, special decal or 17 device issued by the other jurisdiction designating the vehicle is operated by or for a person with disabilities shall be 18 19 exempt from the payment of parking meter fees until January 1, 20 2014, and exempt from any statute or ordinance imposing time 21 limitations on parking, except limitations of one-half hour or 22 less, on any street or highway zone, a parking area subject to regulation under subsection (a) of Section 11-209 of this Code, 23

or any parking lot or parking place which are owned, leased or 1 2 owned and leased by a municipality or a municipal parking utility; and shall be recognized by state and local authorities 3 as a valid license plate or parking device and shall receive 4 5 the same parking privileges as residents of this State; but, 6 such vehicle shall be subject to the laws which prohibit parking in "no stopping" and "no standing" zones in front of or 7 8 near fire hydrants, driveways, public building entrances and 9 exits, bus stops and loading areas, and is prohibited from 10 parking where the motor vehicle constitutes a traffic hazard, 11 whereby such motor vehicle shall be moved at the instruction 12 and request of a law enforcement officer to a location 13 designated by the officer.

(b) Any motor vehicle bearing registration plates or a 14 15 special decal or device specified in this Section or in Section 16 3-616 of this Code or such parking device as specifically 17 authorized in Section 11-1301.2 as evidence that the vehicle is operated by or for a person with disabilities or bearing 18 19 registration plates issued to a disabled veteran under 20 subsection (a) of Section 3-609 may park, in addition to any other lawful place, in any parking place specifically reserved 21 22 for such vehicles by the posting of an official sign as 23 provided under Section 11-301. Parking privileges granted by this Section are strictly limited to the person to whom the 24 25 special registration plates, special decal or device were 26 issued and to qualified operators acting under his or her

express direction while the person with disabilities is present. A person to whom privileges were granted shall, at the request of a police officer or any other person invested by law with authority to direct, control, or regulate traffic, present an identification card with a picture as verification that the person is the person to whom the special registration plates, special decal or device was issued.

8 (c) Such parking privileges granted by this Section are extended 9 also to motor vehicles of not-for-profit 10 organizations used for the transportation of persons with 11 disabilities when such motor vehicles display the decal or 12 device issued pursuant to Section 11-1301.2 of this Code.

13 (d) No person shall use any area for the parking of any 14 motor vehicle pursuant to Section 11-1303 of this Code or where 15 an official sign controlling such area expressly prohibits 16 parking at any time or during certain hours.

17 <u>(e)</u> Beginning January 1, 2014, a vehicle displaying a decal 18 or device issued under subsection (c-5) of Section 11-1301.2 of 19 this Code shall be exempt from the payment of fees generated by 20 <u>on-street</u> parking in a metered space <del>or in a publicly owned</del> 21 <del>parking structure or area</del>.

2 Secretary of State shall provide for, (a) The by 3 administrative rules, the design, size, color, and placement of a person with disabilities motorist decal or device and shall 4 provide for, by administrative rules, the content and form of 5 an application for a person with disabilities motorist decal or 6 7 device, which shall be used by local authorities in the 8 issuance thereof to a person with temporary disabilities, 9 provided that the decal or device is valid for no more than 90 10 days, subject to renewal for like periods based upon continued 11 disability, and further provided that the decal or device 12 clearly sets forth the date that the decal or device expires. 13 The application shall include the requirement of an Illinois Identification Card number or a State of Illinois driver's 14 license number. This decal or device may be used by the 15 16 authorized holder to designate and identify a vehicle not owned 17 or displaying a registration plate as provided in Sections 3-609 and 3-616 of this Act to designate when the vehicle is 18 19 being used to transport said person or persons with 20 disabilities, and thus is entitled to enjoy all the privileges that would be afforded a person with disabilities licensed 21 22 vehicle. Person with disabilities decals or devices issued and 23 displayed pursuant to this Section shall be recognized and honored by all local authorities regardless of which local 24 25 authority issued such decal or device.

The decal or device shall be issued only upon a showing by

adequate documentation that the person for whose benefit the decal or device is to be used has a temporary disability as defined in Section 1-159.1 of this Code <u>and the disability is</u> temporary.

5 (b) The local governing authorities shall be responsible 6 for the provision of such decal or device, its issuance and 7 designated placement within the vehicle. The cost of such decal 8 or device shall be at the discretion of such local governing 9 authority.

10 (c) The Secretary of State may, pursuant to Section 11 3-616(c), issue a person with disabilities parking decal or 12 device to a person with disabilities as defined by Section 13 1-159.1. Any person with disabilities parking decal or device issued by the Secretary of State shall be registered to that 14 15 person with disabilities in the form to be prescribed by the 16 Secretary of State. The person with disabilities parking decal 17 or device shall not display that person's address. One additional decal or device may be issued to an applicant upon 18 his or her written request and with the approval of the 19 20 Secretary of State. The written request must include a justification of the need for the additional decal or device. 21

(c-5) Beginning January 1, 2014, the Secretary shall provide by administrative rule for the issuance of a separate and distinct parking decal or device for persons with disabilities as defined by Section 1-159.1 of this Code <u>and who</u> <u>meet the qualifications under this subsection</u>. The authorized

holder of a decal or device issued under this subsection (c-5) shall be exempt from the payment of fees generated by <u>on-street</u> parking in a metered space, <u>a parking area subject to paragraph</u> (10) of subsection (a) of Section 11-209 of this Code, or <u>a</u> publicly owned parking structure or area.

6 The Secretary shall issue a meter-exempt decal or device to person with disabilities who: 7 (i) has been issued а 8 registration plates under subsection (a) of Section 3-609 or 9 Section 3-616 of this Code or a special decal or device under 10 this Section, (ii) holds a valid Illinois driver's license, 11 and (iii) is unable to do one or more of the following:

(1) manage, manipulate, or insert coins, or obtain tickets or tokens in parking meters or ticket machines in parking lots or parking structures, due to the lack of fine motor control of both hands;

16 (2) reach above his or her head to a height of 42
17 inches from the ground, due to a lack of finger, hand, or
18 upper extremity strength or mobility;

(3) approach a parking meter due to his or her use of awheelchair or other device for mobility; or

(4) walk more than 20 feet due to an orthopedic, neurological, cardiovascular, or lung condition in which the degree of debilitation is so severe that it almost completely impedes the ability to walk.

The application for a meter-exempt parking decal or device shall contain a statement certified by a licensed physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice nurse attesting to the <u>permanent</u> nature and estimated duration of the applicant's condition and verifying that the applicant meets the physical qualifications specified in this subsection (c-5).

5 Notwithstanding the requirements of this subsection (c-5), 6 the Secretary shall issue a meter-exempt decal or device to a 7 person who has been issued registration plates under Section 8 3-616 of this Code or a special decal or device under this 9 Section, if the applicant is the parent or guardian of a person 10 with disabilities who is under 18 years of age and incapable of 11 driving.

(d) Replacement decals or devices may be issued for lost, stolen, or destroyed decals upon application and payment of a \$10 fee. The replacement fee may be waived for individuals that have claimed and received a grant under the Senior Citizens and Disabled Persons Property Tax Relief Act.
