- Section 5. The State Officials and Employees Ethics Act is amended by adding Section 5-16 and changing Section 50-5 as follows:

- 8 Sec. 5-16. Prohibition on use of grant funds for prohibited
- 9 political activities.
- 10 (a) For the purposes of this Section:
- 11 "Employee of a grantee" means any full-time,

- 18 (b) Grantees and employees of grantees shall not
- intentionally use grant funds, or goods or services purchased
- 20 with grant funds, to engage, either directly or indirectly, in

- (c) Grantees and employees of grantees shall not be
- 23 compensated from grant funds for time spent engaging in a

- 4 (a) A person is quilty of a Class A misdemeanor if that

- 9 25-90 is subject to discipline or discharge by the appropriate
- 10 ultimate jurisdictional authority.
