Appropriates \$25,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Supreme Court for reimbursement to counties for the expenses related to P.A. 98-61. Appropriates \$15,000,000 from the General Revenue Fund to the Supreme Court for reimbursement to counties for the expenses related to the transfer of the administration of the Cook County Juvenile Temporary Detention Center from the President of the Cook County Board to the Circuit Court of Cook County. Effective immediately.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented 2 in the General Assembly: 3

4 Section 5. "AN ACT making appropriations", Public Act 98-64, approved July 10, 2013, is amended by changing Section 5 10 of Article 38 as follows: 6

7 (P.A. 98-64, Article 38, Section 10)

8 Sec. 10. The sum of \$63,600,000, or so much thereof as 9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue 10 Fund to the Supreme Court for probation reimbursements.

11 In addition to other sums appropriated, the sum of 12 \$25,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 13 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Supreme 14 Court for reimbursement to counties for the expenses related 15 to Public Act 98-61.

16 In addition to other sums appropriated, the sum of 17 \$15,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is 18 appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Supreme Court for reimbursement to counties for the expenses related 19 20 to the transfer of the administration of the Cook County 21 Juvenile Temporary Detention Center from the President of the 22 Cook County Board to the Circuit Court of Cook County, as
