#### SB3010

### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

430 ILCS 66/65

Amends the Firearm Concealed Carry Act. Provides that nothing in the prohibition on carrying a concealed firearm into any building under the control of an officer of the Executive Branch of government, prohibits a licensee from carrying a concealed firearm onto the real property or building at a Department of Transportation rest area. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act is amended by 5 changing Section 65 as follows:

6 (430 ILCS 66/65)

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7 Sec. 65. Prohibited areas.

8 (a) A licensee under this Act shall not knowingly carry a
9 firearm on or into:

10 (1) Any building, real property, and parking area under
11 the control of a public or private elementary or secondary
12 school.

(2) Any building, real property, and parking area under 13 14 the control of a pre-school or child care facility, including any room or portion of a building under the 15 16 control of a pre-school or child care facility. Nothing in 17 this paragraph shall prevent the operator of a child care facility in a family home from owning or possessing a 18 19 firearm in the home or license under this Act, if no child 20 under child care at the home is present in the home or the 21 firearm in the home is stored in a locked container when a 22 child under child care at the home is present in the home.

(3) Any building, parking area, or portion of a

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building under the control of an officer of the executive 1 2 or legislative branch of government, provided that nothing 3 in this paragraph shall prohibit a licensee from carrying a concealed firearm onto the real property, bikeway, or trail 4 5 in a park regulated by the Department of Natural Resources or any other designated public hunting area or building 6 7 where firearm possession is permitted as established by the 8 Department of Natural Resources under Section 1.8 of the 9 Wildlife Code. Nothing in this paragraph (3) prohibits a 10 licensee from carrying a concealed firearm onto the real 11 property or building at a Department of Transportation rest 12 area.

13 (4) Any building designated for matters before a 14 circuit court, appellate court, or the Supreme Court, or 15 any building or portion of a building under the control of 16 the Supreme Court.

17 (5) Any building or portion of a building under the18 control of a unit of local government.

(6) Any building, real property, and parking area under
the control of an adult or juvenile detention or
correctional institution, prison, or jail.

(7) Any building, real property, and parking area under
the control of a public or private hospital or hospital
affiliate, mental health facility, or nursing home.

(8) Any bus, train, or form of transportation paid for
in whole or in part with public funds, and any building,

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real property, and parking area under the control of a public transportation facility paid for in whole or in part with public funds.

(9) Any building, real property, and parking area under 4 5 the control of an establishment that serves alcohol on its premises, if more than 50% of the establishment's gross 6 7 receipts within the prior 3 months is from the sale of 8 alcohol. The owner of an establishment who knowingly fails 9 to prohibit concealed firearms on its premises as provided 10 in this paragraph or who knowingly makes a false statement 11 or record to avoid the prohibition on concealed firearms 12 under this paragraph is subject to the penalty under subsection (c-5) of Section 10-1 of the Liquor Control Act 13 14 of 1934.

(10) Any public gathering or special event conducted on property open to the public that requires the issuance of a permit from the unit of local government, provided this prohibition shall not apply to a licensee who must walk through a public gathering in order to access his or her residence, place of business, or vehicle.

(11) Any building or real property that has been issued a Special Event Retailer's license as defined in Section 1-3.17.1 of the Liquor Control Act during the time designated for the sale of alcohol by the Special Event Retailer's license, or a Special use permit license as defined in subsection (q) of Section 5-1 of the Liquor Control Act during the time designated for the sale of
 alcohol by the Special use permit license.

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(12) Any public playground.

4 (13) Any public park, athletic area, or athletic
5 facility under the control of a municipality or park
6 district, provided nothing in this Section shall prohibit a
7 licensee from carrying a concealed firearm while on a trail
8 or bikeway if only a portion of the trail or bikeway
9 includes a public park.

10 (14) Any real property under the control of the Cook11 County Forest Preserve District.

12 Any building, classroom, laboratory, medical (15)13 clinic, hospital, artistic venue, athletic venue, 14 entertainment venue, officially recognized 15 university-related organization property, whether owned or 16 leased, and any real property, including parking areas, 17 sidewalks, and common areas under the control of a public or private community college, college, or university. 18

(16) Any building, real property, or parking area under the control of a gaming facility licensed under the Riverboat Gambling Act or the Illinois Horse Racing Act of 1975, including an inter-track wagering location licensee.

(17) Any stadium, arena, or the real property or
 parking area under the control of a stadium, arena, or any
 collegiate or professional sporting event.

(18) Any building, real property, or parking area under

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the control of a public library. 1

2 (19) Any building, real property, or parking area under the control of an airport. 3

(20) Any building, real property, or parking area under 4 5 the control of an amusement park.

(21) Any building, real property, or parking area under 6 the control of a zoo or museum. 7

8 (22) Any street, driveway, parking area, property, 9 building, or facility, owned, leased, controlled, or used 10 by a nuclear energy, storage, weapons, or development site 11 or facility regulated by the federal Nuclear Regulatory 12 Commission. The licensee shall not under any circumstance store a firearm or ammunition in his or her vehicle or in a 13 14 compartment or container within a vehicle located anywhere 15 in or on the street, driveway, parking area, property, 16 building, or facility described in this paragraph.

17 (23) Any area where firearms are prohibited under federal law. 18

19 (a-5) Nothing in this Act shall prohibit a public or private community college, college, or university from: 20

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(1) prohibiting persons from carrying a firearm within 22 a vehicle owned, leased, or controlled by the college or 23 university;

24 (2) developing resolutions, regulations, or policies 25 regarding student, employee, or visitor misconduct and 26 discipline, including suspension and expulsion;

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1 (3) developing resolutions, regulations, or policies 2 regarding the storage or maintenance of firearms, which 3 must include designated areas where persons can park 4 vehicles that carry firearms; and

5 (4) permitting the carrying or use of firearms for the 6 purpose of instruction and curriculum of officially 7 recognized programs, including but not limited to military 8 science and law enforcement training programs, or in any 9 designated area used for hunting purposes or target 10 shooting.

(a-10) The owner of private real property of any type may prohibit the carrying of concealed firearms on the property under his or her control. The owner must post a sign in accordance with subsection (d) of this Section indicating that firearms are prohibited on the property, unless the property is a private residence.

17 (b) Notwithstanding subsections (a), (a-5), and (a-10) of this Section except under paragraph (22) or (23) of subsection 18 (a), any licensee prohibited from carrying a concealed firearm 19 into the parking area of a prohibited location specified in 20 subsection (a), (a-5), or (a-10) of this Section shall be 21 22 permitted to carry a concealed firearm on or about his or her 23 person within a vehicle into the parking area and may store a firearm or ammunition concealed in a case within a locked 24 25 vehicle or locked container out of plain view within the 26 vehicle in the parking area. A licensee may carry a concealed

firearm in the immediate area surrounding his or her vehicle 1 2 within a prohibited parking lot area only for the limited 3 purpose of storing or retrieving a firearm within the vehicle's trunk, provided the licensee ensures the concealed firearm is 4 5 unloaded prior to exiting the vehicle. For purposes of this 6 subsection, "case" includes a glove compartment or console that 7 completely encloses the concealed firearm or ammunition, the 8 trunk of the vehicle, or a firearm carrying box, shipping box, 9 or other container.

10 (c) A licensee shall not be in violation of this Section 11 while he or she is traveling along a public right of way that 12 touches or crosses any of the premises under subsection (a), (a-5), or (a-10) of this Section if the concealed firearm is 13 14 carried on his or her person in accordance with the provisions of this Act or is being transported in a vehicle by the 15 16 licensee in accordance with all other applicable provisions of 17 law.

Signs stating that the carrying of firearms 18 (d) is prohibited shall be clearly and conspicuously posted at the 19 20 entrance of a building, premises, or real property specified in this Section as a prohibited area, unless the building or 21 22 premises is a private residence. Signs shall be of a uniform 23 design as established by the Department and shall be 4 inches by 6 inches in size. The Department shall adopt rules for 24 25 standardized signs to be used under this subsection.
