## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Wildlife Code. Adds the Gray wolf, American black bear, and Cougar to the list of protected species under the Act.

1 AN ACT concerning wildlife.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- 4 Section 5. The Wildlife Code is amended by changing Section
- 5 2.2 as follows:
- 6 (520 ILCS 5/2.2) (from Ch. 61, par. 2.2)
- 7 Sec. 2.2. This Act shall apply only to the wild birds and
- 8 parts of wild birds (including, but not limited to, their nests
- 9 and eggs), and wild mammals and parts of wild mammals, which
- 10 shall include their green hides, in the State of Illinois, or
- 11 which may be brought into the State.
- Wildlife protected by this Act, hereby defined as protected
- 13 species, include the following wild species and all wild
- 14 species contained in listed families, including, but not
- limited to, groups of wild species preceding each family name:
- 16 (except the House Sparrow, Passer domesticus; European
- 17 Starling, Sturnus vulgaris; and Rock Pigeon, Domestic Pigeon,
- 18 Columba livia; Purple Swamphen, Porphyrio porphyio; or Muscovy
- 19 Duck, Cairina moschata). GAME BIRDS-Ruffed grouse, Bonasa
- 20 umbellus; Sharp-tailed grouse, Tympanuchus phasianellus;
- 21 Northern Bobwhite, Colinus virginianus; Gray Partridge, Perdix
- 22 perdix; Chukar, Alectoris chukar; Ring-necked Pheasant,
- 23 Phasianus colchicus; Greater Prairie Chicken, Tympanuchus

1 cupido; Wild Turkey, Meleagris gallopavo. MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS-Waterfowl including brant, ducks, geese, and swans, 2 Anatidae; wild species of the families Rallidae, Scolopacidae, 3 Columbidae, and Corvidae that may be legally hunted as provided for in Section 2.18 of this Act. RESIDENT AND MIGRATORY 5 6 BIRDS-Loons, Gaviidae; grebes, Podicipedidae; NON-GAME 7 pelicans, Pelecanidae; gannets, Sulidae; cormorants, 8 Phalacrocoracidae; anhingas, Anhingidae; frigatebirds, 9 Fregatidae; herons, bitterns and egrets, Ardeidae; ibises and 10 spoonbills, Threskiornithidae; storks, Ciconiidae; vultures, 11 Cathartidae; kites, hawks, ospreys, and eagles, Accipitridae; 12 falcons, merlins, and kestrels, Falconidae; rails, gallinules, 13 and moorhens, which may not be legally hunted, Rallidae; 14 cranes, Gruidae; all shorebirds that may not be legally hunted, 15 families Charadriidae, Scolopacidae, 16 Recurvirostridae gulls, terns, jaegers, skimmers, and 17 kittiwakes, Laridae; dovekies and murrelets, Alcidae; doves and pigeons, which may not be legally hunted, Columbidae; 18 cuckoos and anis, Cuculidae; owls, Tytonidae and Strigidae; 19 20 whip-poor-wills, chuck-will's-widows, and nighthawks, Caprimulgidae; swifts, Apodidae; hummingbirds, Trochilidae, 21 22 Kingfishers, Alcedinidae; woodpeckers, flickers, and 23 sapsuckers, Picidae; kingbirds, pewees, phoebes, and flycatchers, Tyrannidae shrikes, Laniidae; vireos, Vireonidae; 24 25 magpies, ravens, and jays, Corvidae; larks, Alaudidae; 26 swallows and martins, Hirundinidae; chickadees and titmice,

1 Paridae; nuthatches, Sittidae; creepers, Certhiidae; wrens, 2 Troglodytidae; kinglets, Regulidae; gnatcatchers, Sylviidae; robins, bluebirds, solitaires, veerys, and thrushes, Turdidae; 3 mockingbirds, catbirds, and thrashers, Mimidae; 4 pipits, 5 Motacillidae; waxwings, Bombycillidae; warblers, parulas, 6 redstarts, ovenbirds, waterthrushes, yellowthroats, and chats, Parulidae; tanagers, Thraupidae; towhees, longspurs, sparrows, 7 8 buntings, and juncos, Emberizidae; dickcissels, cardinals, 9 grosbeaks, Cardinalidae; blackbirds, buntings, and 10 meadowlarks, bobolinks, grackles, cowbirds, and orioles, 11 Icteridae; grosbeaks, finches, crossbills, redpolls, and 12 siskins, Fringillidae. GAME MAMMALS-Woodchuck, Marmota monax; Gray squirrel, Sciurus carolinensis; Fox squirrel, Sciurus 13 Eastern cottontail, Sylvilagus floridanus; 14 niger; 15 rabbit, Sylvilagus aquaticus; White-tailed deer, Odocoileus 16 virginianus. FUR-BEARING MAMMALS-Muskrat, Ondatra zibethicus; 17 Beaver, Castor canadensis; Raccoon, Procyon lotor; Opossum, Didelphis virginiana; Least weasel, 18 Mustela nivalis; 19 Long-tailed weasel, Mustela frenata; Mink, Mustela vison; 20 River otter, Lontra canadensis; Striped skunk, Mephitis 21 mephitis; Badger, Taxidea taxus; Red fox, Vulpes vulpes; Gray 22 fox, Urocyon cinereoargenteus; Coyote, Canis latrans; Bobcat, 23 Lynx rufus. OTHER MAMMALS-Flying squirrel, Glaucomys volans; squirrel, Tamiasciurus hudsonicus; Eastern Woodrat, 24 25 Neotoma floridana; Golden Mouse, Ochrotomys nuttalli; Rice 26 Rat, Oryzomys palustris; Franklin's Ground Squirrel,

- 1 Spermophilus franklinii; Bats, Vespertilionidae; Gray wolf,
- 2 Canis lupus; American black bear, Ursus americanus; Cougar,
- 3 Puma concolor.
- It shall be unlawful for any person at any time to take,
- 5 possess, sell, or offer for sale, propagate, or release into
- 6 the wild, any of these wild birds (dead or alive) and parts of
- 7 wild birds (including, but not limited to, their nests and
- 8 eggs), wild mammals (dead or alive) and parts of wild mammals,
- 9 including their green hides contrary to the provisions of this
- 10 Act. However, nothing in this Act shall prohibit bona-fide
- 11 public or state scientific, educational or zoological
- institutions from receiving, holding, and displaying protected
- species that were salvaged or legally obtained.
- 14 It shall be unlawful for any person to take any other
- 15 living wildlife animal not covered by this Act without the
- 16 permission of the landowner or tenant.
