### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the General Assembly Compensation Act. Provides that, beginning on the second Wednesday in January, 2017, the chairmen and minority spokesmen of standing committees in the Senate and the House of Representatives shall not receive compensation for service in that capacity. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The General Assembly Compensation Act is amended
by changing Section 1 as follows:

6 (25 ILCS 115/1) (from Ch. 63, par. 14)
7 Sec. 1. <u>Salary; stipends; travel, food, and lodging</u>
8 <u>reimbursement.</u>

9 <u>(a)</u> Each member of the General Assembly shall receive an 10 annual salary of \$28,000 or as set by the Compensation Review 11 Board, whichever is greater.

12 (b) The following named officers <u>and conference and caucus</u>, 13 committee chairmen <del>and committee minority spokesmen</del> shall 14 receive additional amounts per year for their services as such 15 officers <u>and</u>, <u>committee</u> chairmen <del>and committee minority</del> 16 <del>spokesmen</del> respectively, as set by the Compensation Review Board 17 or, as follows, whichever is greater:

18 (1) during terms of office beginning on or after

20 <u>(A)</u> the Speaker and the minority leader of the 21 House of Representatives and the President and the 22 minority leader of the Senate, \$16,000 each;

(C) 6 assistant majority leaders and 5 assistant minority leaders in the Senate, \$12,000 each;

<u>(D)</u> 6 assistant majority leaders and 6 assistant minority leaders in the House of Representatives, \$10,500 each;

<u>(E)</u> 2 Deputy Majority leaders in the House of Representatives \$11,500 each; and

<u>(F)</u> 2 Deputy Minority leaders in the House of Representatives, \$11,500 each;

(G) the majority caucus chairman and minority caucus chairman in the Senate, \$12,000 each; and

13 (2) during terms of office beginning <u>on or after</u> the 14 second Wednesday in January, 1989, the majority conference 15 chairman and the minority conference chairman in the House 16 of Representatives, \$10,500 each; <u>and</u>

17 <u>(3) during terms of office</u> beginning <u>on or after</u> the 18 second Wednesday in January, 1989, <u>and before the second</u> 19 <u>Wednesday in January, 2017,</u> the chairman and minority 20 spokesman of each standing committee of the Senate, except 21 the Rules Committee, the Committee on Committees, and the 22 Committee on Assignment of Bills, \$6,000 each; and

(4) during terms of office beginning on or after the
 second Wednesday in January, 1989, and before the second
 Wednesday in January, 2017, the chairman and minority
 spokesman of each standing and select committee of the

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House of Representatives, \$6,000 each.

2 <u>During terms of office beginning on or after the second</u>
3 <u>Wednesday in January, 2017, the chairmen and minority spokesmen</u>
4 <u>of standing committees in the Senate and House of</u>
5 <u>Representatives shall not receive additional compensation for</u>
6 <u>service in that capacity.</u>

A member who serves in more than one position as an 7 8 officer, caucus committee chairman, or conference chairman 9 committee minority spokesman shall receive only one additional 10 amount based on the position paying the highest additional 11 amount. The compensation provided for in this Section to be 12 paid per year to members of the General Assembly, including the 13 additional sums payable per year to officers of the General Assembly shall be paid in 12 equal monthly installments. The 14 15 first such installment is payable on January 31, 1977. All 16 subsequent equal monthly installments are payable on the last 17 working day of the month. A member who has held office any part of a month is entitled to compensation for an entire month. 18

(c) Mileage shall be paid at the rate of 20 cents per mile 19 before January 9, 1985, and at the mileage allowance rate in 20 effect under regulations promulgated pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 21 22 5707(b)(2) beginning January 9, 1985, for the number of actual 23 highway miles necessarily and conveniently traveled by the most feasible route to be present upon convening of the sessions of 24 25 the General Assembly by such member in each and every trip 26 during each session in going to and returning from the seat of

government, to be computed by the Comptroller. A member 1 2 traveling by public transportation for such purposes, however, 3 shall be paid his actual cost of that transportation instead of on the mileage rate if his cost of public transportation 4 5 exceeds the amount to which he would be entitled on a mileage basis. No member may be paid, whether on a mileage basis or for 6 7 actual costs of public transportation, for more than one such 8 trip for each week the General Assembly is actually in session. 9 Each member shall also receive an allowance of \$36 per day for 10 lodging and meals while in attendance at sessions of the 11 General Assembly before January 9, 1985; beginning January 9, 12 1985, such food and lodging allowance shall be equal to the amount per day permitted to be deducted for such expenses under 13 14 the Internal Revenue Code; however, beginning May 31, 1995, no 15 allowance for food and lodging while in attendance at sessions 16 is authorized for periods of time after the last day in May of 17 each calendar year, except (i) if the General Assembly is convened in special session by either the Governor or the 18 presiding officers of both houses, as provided by subsection 19 20 (b) of Section 5 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution or (ii) if the General Assembly is convened to consider bills 21 22 vetoed, item vetoed, reduced, or returned with specific 23 recommendations for change by the Governor as provided in Section 9 of Article IV of the Illinois Constitution. For 24 25 fiscal year 2011 and for session days in fiscal years 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 only (i) the allowance for lodging and 26

meals is \$111 per day and (ii) mileage for automobile travel shall be reimbursed at a rate of \$0.39 per mile.

Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, beginning in fiscal year 2012, travel reimbursement for General Assembly members on non-session days shall be calculated using the guidelines set forth by the Legislative Travel Control Board, except that fiscal year 2012, 2013, 2014, and 2015 mileage reimbursement is set at a rate of \$0.39 per mile.

9 <u>(d)</u> If a member dies having received only a portion of the 10 amount payable as compensation, the unpaid balance shall be 11 paid to the surviving spouse of such member, or, if there be 12 none, to the estate of such member.
