### SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the Coal Mining Act. Defines "recorder". Provides that a mine examiner shall record the report either by calling out to a recorder or personally recording the report. Provides that the recorder or mine examiner shall record the report in a book or computer system that is provided by the operator for that purpose, and the book or computer system shall be secure and not susceptible to alteration. Makes other changes. Effective immediately.

# 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Coal Mining Act is amended by changing 5 Sections 5.11, 6.10, and 6.11 and by adding Section 1.25 as 6 follows:

7 (225 ILCS 705/1.25 new)

8 <u>Sec. 1.25. Recorder. "Recorder" means a person trained and</u> 9 <u>designated by the operator as the individual responsible for</u> 10 <u>recording the mine examiner's examination of the underground</u> 11 workings of the mine.

12 (225 ILCS 705/5.11) (from Ch. 96 1/2, par. 511)

13 Sec. 5.11. To see that a mine examiner makes the examinations provided in Articles 5, 6, and 31 of this Act, and 14 15 that he or she enters his or her report either by calling it 16 out to the surface to a recorder or by personally recording the report. The recorder or mine examiner shall record the report 17 18 in a book or computer system that is provided by the operator 19 for that purpose, and the book or computer system shall be 20 secure and not susceptible to alteration. thereof with 21 indelible pencil or ink in a well-bound or properly protected loose leaf book provided by the operator for that purpose. 22

Upon completing his or her examination, he or 4 she shall make a daily record of the same either by calling out 5 the results of the examination to a recorder or by personally 6 recording the report. The recorder or mine examiner shall 7 record the report in a book or computer system that is provided by the operator for that purpose, and the book or computer 8 9 system shall be secure and not susceptible to alteration. The 10 mine examination report is in a book kept for that purpose, for 11 the information of the company, the State Mine Inspector, and all other persons interested; and this report record shall be 12 13 recorded made each morning before the miners are permitted to 14 enter the mine. 15 (Source: Laws 1953, p. 701.)

17 Sec. 6.11. Should any dangerous conditions be found as 18 described in Section 6.09, he or she shall call the conditions 19 out to a recorder or shall personally record the report. The 20 recorder or mine examiner shall record the report in a book or computer system that is provided by the operator for that 21 22 purpose, and the book or computer system shall be secure and 23 not susceptible to alteration. The recorder or mine examiner shall ensure that the report sets record the same in the daily 24

1 record book of examinations, setting forth the nature of the 2 conditions found and the location of same.
