SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

105 ILCS 5/27A-5.5 new

Amends the Charter Schools Law of the School Code. Requires a charter school to comply with all applicable absenteeism and truancy policies and requirements applicable to public schools under the laws of the State of Illinois. Sets forth how a charter school must define a truant, chronic or habitual truant, truant minor, and dropout. Effective immediately.

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2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by adding Section
27A-5.5 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/27A-5.5 new)

7 <u>Sec. 27A-5.5. Charter school truancy.</u>

8 <u>(a) A charter school shall comply with all applicable</u> 9 <u>absenteeism and truancy policies and requirements applicable</u> 10 <u>to public schools under the laws of the State of Illinois.</u>

11 (b) A charter school shall define a truant as a child who 12 is subject to compulsory school attendance and who is absent 13 without valid cause from such attendance for a school day or 14 portion thereof.

15 (c) A charter school shall define a chronic or habitual 16 truant as a child who is subject to compulsory school 17 attendance and who is absent without valid cause from such 18 attendance for 5% or more of the previous 180 regular 19 attendance days.

20 <u>(d) A charter school shall define a truant minor as a</u> 21 <u>chronic truant to whom supportive services, including</u> 22 <u>prevention, diagnostic, intervention, and remedial services,</u> 23 <u>alternative programs, and other school and community resources</u>

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have been provided and have failed to result in the cessation
 of chronic truancy or have been offered and refused.

3 (e) A charter school shall define a dropout as any child enrolled in grades 9 through 12 whose name has been removed 4 5 from the charter school enrollment roster for any reason other 6 than the student's death, extended illness, removal for medical non-compliance, expulsion, aging out, graduation, or 7 completion of a program of studies and who has not transferred 8 to another public or private school and is not known to be 9 home-schooled by his or her parents or guardians or continuing 10 11 school in another country.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
