SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

New Act

Creates the Residential and Economic Redlining Task Force Act. Creates the Residential and Economic Redlining Task Force. Provides that the task force shall (1) prepare a report evaluating the current State laws and rules designed to curb residential and economic redlining, and (2) provide recommendations to the General Assembly as to whether further legislation is needed to address the problems of residential and economic redlining in this State. Contains a repealer provision.

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AN ACT concerning regulation.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Residential and Economic Redlining Task Force Act.

6 Section 5. Residential and Economic Redlining Task Force7 Act.

8 (a) There is hereby created the Residential and Economic9 Redlining Task Force Act.

10 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members:

(1) Four members of the General Assembly, appointed one
each by the President of the Senate, the Minority Leader of
the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives;

(2) The Governor, or his or her designee;

16 (3) The Secretary of Financial and Professional
17 Regulation, or his or her designee;

18 (4) The Secretary of Human Services, or his or her19 designee;

20 (5) The Attorney General of the State of Illinois, or
21 his or her designee; and

(6) Two members from entities representing the
 interests of the retail and banking industries in this

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State appointed by the Governor.

Secretary of Financial and Professional 2 (C) The 3 Regulation, or his or her designee, shall serve as chairperson of the task force, and the Department of Financial and 4 5 Professional Regulation shall provide technical support and assistance to the task force and shall be responsible for 6 7 administering its operations and ensuring that the 8 requirements of this Act are met.

9 (d) The task force may consult with any persons or entities 10 it deems necessary to carry out its purposes.

11 (e) Members of the task force shall be appointed no later 12 than 90 days after the effective date of this Act. The members 13 of the task force shall receive no compensation for serving as members of the task force. 14

15 (f) The task force shall (1) prepare a report evaluating 16 the current State laws and rules designed to curb residential 17 and economic redlining, and (2) provide recommendations to the General Assembly as to whether further legislation is needed to 18 address the problems of residential and economic redlining in 19 20 this State.

21 (q) The task force shall submit its report and 22 recommendations to the General Assembly on or before January 1, 23 2017.

24 Section 10. Expiration. This Act is repealed on January 1, 25 2018.
