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1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Article 0.5

Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and 5 reappropriations for State fiscal year 2017. Article 3, 6 7 contains reappropriations of certain appropriations 8 reappropriations from State fiscal year 2015 as provided in Public Act 98-681, as may have been reappropriated for State 9 10 fiscal year 2016 by a Public Act of the 99th General 11 Assembly. To the extent that such a Public Act has not been 12 enacted, Articles 4 contains appropriations of identical amounts and purposes to those in Article 3 but as new 13 14 appropriations rather than as reappropriations. Section 99 15 of Article 99 sets forth an effective date that causes Article 3 to become effective if, and only if, an applicable 16 Public Act of the 99th General Assembly should be enacted; 17 18 should such not be enacted, the Section causes Article 4 to 19 become effective.

Section 35. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Road Fund to the Department of Transportation for repair of damages by motorists to state vehicles and equipment or replacement of state vehicles and equipment, provided such amount not exceed funds to be made available from collections from claims filed by the Department to recover the costs of such damages.
