1 AN ACT making appropriations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 0.2

Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and 5 reappropriations for State fiscal year 2017. Articles 1, 4, 6 7 5, 6, 9, 12, 13, 17, 21, 22, 24, 28, and 29 contain of certain appropriations 8 reappropriations reappropriations from State fiscal year 2015 as provided in 9 Public Act 98-675, as may have been reappropriated for State 10 11 fiscal year 2016 by a Public Act of the 99th General 12 Assembly. To the extent that such a Public Act has not been 13 enacted, Articles 30 through 42 contain appropriations of 14 identical amounts and purposes to those in Articles 1, 4, 5, 15 9, 12, 13, 17, 21, 22, 24, 28, and 29 but as new appropriations rather than as reappropriations. 16 Section 99 of Article 99 sets forth an effective date that causes 17 18 Articles 1, 4, 5, 6, 9, 12, 13, 17, 21, 22, 24, 28, and 29 to become effective if, and only if, an applicable Public Act of 19 20 the 99th General Assembly should be enacted; should such not be enacted, the Section causes Articles 30 through 42 to 21 22 become effective.

1 ARTICLE 0.5

2 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations 3 made in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, 4 5 School Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond 6 Series B Fund, the Coal Development Fund, the Transportation 7 8 Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be 9 paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds 10 subsequently issued by the State.

11 ARTICLE 1
