SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Proposes to amend the Executive Article of the Illinois Constitution. Eliminates the office of Lieutenant Governor, beginning with the term of office otherwise commencing in 2019. Effective upon being declared adopted.

2	CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

3 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETY-NINTH GENERAL 4 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 5 CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the 6 electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of 7 8 this resolution a proposition to amend Article V of the 9 Illinois Constitution by changing Sections 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 10 and by repealing Sections 4 and 14 as follows:

11 ARTICLE V

THE EXECUTIVE

13 (ILCON Art. V, Sec. 1)

14 SECTION 1. OFFICERS

The Executive Branch shall include a Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller and Treasurer elected by the electors of the State. They shall keep the public records and maintain a residence at the seat of government during their terms of office.

22 SECTION 2. TERMS

1 These elected officers of the Executive Branch shall hold 2 office for four years beginning on the second Monday of January 3 after their election and, except in the case of the Lieutenant 4 Covernor, until their successors are qualified. They shall be 5 elected at the general election in 1978 and every four years 6 thereafter.

9 SECTION 3. ELIGIBILITY

10 To be eligible to hold the office of Governor, Lieutenant 11 Governor, Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller or 12 Treasurer, a person must be a United States citizen, at least 13 25 years old, and a resident of this State for the three years 14 preceding his <u>or her</u> election.

17 SECTION 4. JOINT ELECTION (REP.)

18 In the general election for Covernor and Lieutenant 19 Covernor, one vote shall be cast jointly for the candidates 20 nominated by the same political party or petition. The General 21 Assembly may provide by law for the joint nomination of 22 candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor.

(ILCON Art. V, Sec. 6) 1 2 SECTION 6. GUBERNATORIAL SUCCESSION 3 (a) In the event of a vacancy, the order of succession to the office of Governor or to the position of Acting Governor 4 5 shall be the Lieutenant Governor, the elected Attorney General, the elected Secretary of State, and then as provided by law. 6 7 (b) If the Governor is unable to serve because of death, 8 conviction on impeachment, failure to qualify, resignation or

9 other disability, the office of Governor shall be filled by the 10 officer next in line of succession for the remainder of the 11 term or until the disability is removed.

12 (c) Whenever the Governor determines that he may be 13 seriously impeded in the exercise of his <u>or her</u> powers, he <u>or</u> 14 <u>she</u> shall so notify the Secretary of State and the officer next 15 in line of succession. The latter shall thereafter become 16 Acting Governor with the duties and powers of Governor. When 17 the Governor is prepared to resume office, he <u>or she</u> shall do 18 so by notifying the Secretary of State and the Acting Governor.

(d) The General Assembly by law shall specify by whom and by what procedures the ability of the Governor to serve or to resume office may be questioned and determined. The Supreme Court shall have original and exclusive jurisdiction to review such a law and any such determination and, in the absence of such a law, shall make the determination under such rules as it may adopt.

2	SECTION 7. VACANCIES IN OTHER ELECTIVE OFFICES
3	If the Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller or
4	Treasurer fails to qualify or if his <u>or her</u> office becomes
5	vacant, the Governor shall fill the office by appointment. The
6	appointee shall hold office until the elected officer qualifies
7	or until a successor is elected and qualified as may be
8	provided by law and shall not be subject to removal by the
9	Governor. If the Lieutenant Governor fails to qualify or if his
10	office becomes vacant, it shall remain vacant until the end of
11	the term.

14	SECTION 14. LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR - DUTIES (REP.)
15	The Lieutenant Governor shall perform the duties and
16	exercise the powers in the Executive Branch that may be
17	delegated to him by the Governor and that may be prescribed by
18	law.
