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AN ACT concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing
Sections 4-6, 4-6.1, 5-5, 5-16.1, 6-29, 6-50, and 6-50.1 as
follows:

7 (10 ILCS 5/4-6) (from Ch. 46, par. 4-6)

8 Sec. 4-6. For the purpose of registering voters under this Article in addition to the method provided for precinct 9 registration under Section 4-7, the office of the county 10 clerk shall be open every day, except Saturday, Sunday, and 11 legal holidays, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. On Saturdays the 12 13 hours of registration shall be from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon, and such additional hours as the county clerk may designate. 14 15 If, however, the county board otherwise duly regulates and 16 fixes the hours of opening and closing of all county offices at the county seat of any county, such regulation shall 17 18 control and supersede the hours herein specified. There shall be no registration at the office of the county clerk or at 19 20 the office of municipal and township or road district clerks serving as deputy registrars during the 28 days preceding any 21 22 regular or special election at which the cards provided in this Article are used, or until the 2nd day following such 23 regular or special election; provided, that if by reason of 24 the proximity of any such elections to one another the effect 25 26 of this provision would be to close registrations for all or 27 any part of the 10 days immediately prior to such 28 day period, the county clerk shall accept, solely for use in the 28 subsequent and not in any intervening election, registrations 29 and transfers of registration within the period from the 28th 30 to the 38th days, both inclusive, prior to such subsequent 31

1 election; provided, further that at the office of such clerks 2 registration shall be permitted on the 28th day preceding the election in November of even-numbered years in any county in 3 4 which such day is not designated as a day of precinct 5 registration. In any election called for the submission of 6 the revision or alteration of, or the amendments to the 7 Constitution, submitted by a Constitutional Convention, the the office of the election 8 final day for registration at 9 authority charged with the printing of the ballot of this election shall be the 15th day prior to the date of election. 10

11 Any qualified person residing within the county or any 12 portion thereof subject to this Article may register or 13 re-register with the county clerk. <u>The county clerk shall</u> 14 provide for precinct registration on election day. A person 15 <u>registering on election day must be a resident of the</u> 16 precinct in which he or she registers.

Each county clerk shall appoint one or more registration 17 or re-registration teams for the purpose of accepting the 18 19 registration or re-registration of any voter who files an 20 affidavit that he is physically unable to appear at any 21 appointed place of registration or re-registration. Each team 22 shall consist of one member of each political party having 23 the highest and second highest number of registered voters in the county. The county clerk shall designate a team to visit 24 25 each disabled person and shall accept the registration or re-registration of each such person as if he had applied for 26 registration or re-registration at the office of the county 27 clerk. 28

As used in this Article, "deputy registrars" and "registration officers" mean any person authorized to accept registrations of electors under this Article. (Source: P.A. 83-1059.)

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1 Sec. 4-6.1. In addition to registration at the office of 2 the county clerk, and at the offices of municipal and township or road district clerks, each county clerk shall 3 4 provide for following additional methods the of 5 registration:

6 (1) the appointment of deputy registrars as 7 provided in Section 4-6.2; and

8 (2) the establishment of temporary places of
9 registration, as provided in Section 4-6.3.

Each county clerk may provide for precinct registration pursuant to Section 4-7 <u>in addition to precinct registration</u> <u>on election day as provided in Section 4-6</u>.

15 Sec. 5-5. For the purpose of registering voters under this Article 5, in addition to the method provided for 16 17 precinct registration under Sections 5-6 and 5-17 of this 18 Article 5, the office of the county clerk shall be open between 9:00 a. m. and 5:00 p. m. 19 on all days except Saturday, Sunday and holidays, but there shall be 20 no registration at such office during the 35 days immediately 21 22 preceding any election required to be held under the law but. if no precinct registration is being conducted prior to any 23 24 election then registration may be taken in the office of the county clerk up to and including the 29th day prior to an 25 election. On Saturdays, the hours of registration shall 26 be 27 from 9:00 a. m. to 12:00 p. m. noon. During such 35 or 28 day period, registration of electors of political subdivisions 28 29 wherein a regular, or special election is required to be held shall cease and shall not be resumed for the registration of 30 31 electors of such political subdivisions until the second day following the day of such election. In any election called 32 for the submission of the revision or alteration of, or the 33

1 amendments to the Constitution, submitted by a Constitutional 2 Convention, the final day for registration at the office of the election authority charged with the printing of the 3 4 ballot of this election shall be the 15th day prior to the the election. The county clerk shall provide for 5 date of precinct registration on election day. A person registering 6 on election day must be a resident of the precinct in which 7 8 he or she registers.

9 Each county clerk shall appoint one deputy for the 10 purpose of accepting the registration of any voter who files 11 an affidavit that he is physically unable to appear at any 12 appointed place of registration. The county clerk shall 13 designate a deputy to visit each disabled person and shall 14 accept the registration of each such person as if he had 15 applied for registration at the office of the county clerk.

16 The offices of city, village, incorporated town and town clerks shall also be open for the purpose of registering 17 voters residing in the territory in which this Article is in 18 19 effect, and also, in the case of city, village and incorporated town clerks, for the purpose of registering 20 21 voters residing in a portion of the city, village or incorporated town not located within the county, on all days 22 23 on which the office of the county clerk is open for the registration of voters of such cities, villages, incorporated 24 25 towns and townships.

Sec. 5-16.1. In addition to registration at the office of the county clerk and at the offices of municipal and township clerks, each county subject to this Article shall provide for the following methods of registration:

32 (1) The appointment of deputy registrars as provided in
33 Section 5-16.2;

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(2) The establishment of temporary places of
 registration as provided in Section 5-16.3.

Each county subject to this Article may provide for precinct registration pursuant to Section 5-17 <u>in addition to</u> <u>precinct registration on election day as provided in Section</u> <u>5 5-5</u>.

Sec. 6-29. For the purpose of registering voters under 9 10 this Article, the office of the Board of Election Commissioners shall be open during ordinary business hours of 11 each week day, from 9 a.m. to 12 o'clock noon on the last 12 four Saturdays immediately preceding the end of the period of 13 registration preceding each election, and such other days and 14 15 such other times as the board may direct. During the 28 days immediately preceding any election there shall be no 16 17 registration of voters at the office of the Board of Election 18 Commissioners in cities, villages and incorporated towns of fewer than 200,000 inhabitants. In cities, villages and 19 20 incorporated towns of 200,000 or more inhabitants, there 21 shall be no registration of voters at the office of the Board 22 of Election Commissioners during the 35 days immediately preceding any election; provided, however, where no precinct 23 24 registration is being conducted prior to any election then registration may be taken in the office of the Board up to 25 and including the 29th day prior to such election. The Board 26 Election Commissioners may set up and establish as many 27 of 28 branch offices for the purpose of taking registrations as it 29 may deem necessary, and the branch offices may be open on any all dates and hours during which registrations may be 30 or 31 taken in the main office. All officers and employees of the Board of Election Commissioners who are authorized by such 32 33 board to take registrations under this Article shall be

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considered officers of the circuit court, and shall be
 subject to the same control as is provided by Section 14-5 of
 this Act with respect to judges of election.

In any election called for the submission of the revision or alteration of, or the amendments to the Constitution, submitted by a Constitutional Convention, the final day for registration at the office of the election authority charged with the printing of the ballot of this election shall be the 15th day prior to the date of election.

10The board shall provide for precinct registration on11election day. A person registering on election day must be a12resident of the precinct in which he or she registers.

The Board of Election Commissioners shall appoint one or 13 more registration teams, consisting of 2 of its employees for 14 15 each team, for the purpose of accepting the registration of 16 any voter who files an affidavit, within the period for taking registrations provided for in this article, that he is 17 physically unable to appear at the office of the Board or at 18 19 any appointed place of registration. On the day or days when a precinct registration is being conducted such teams shall 20 21 consist of one member from each of the 2 leading political 22 parties who are serving on the Precinct Registration Board. 23 Each team so designated shall visit each disabled person and shall accept the registration of such person the same as if 24 25 he had applied for registration in person.

Any otherwise qualified person who is absent from his 26 county of residence due to business of the United States, 27 or who is temporarily residing outside the territorial limits of 28 29 the United States, may make application to become registered by mail to the Board of Election Commissioners within the 30 periods for registration provided for in this Article or by 31 32 simultaneous application for absentee registration and absentee ballot as provided in Article 20 of this Code. 33

34 Upon receipt of such application the Board of Election

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1 Commissioners shall immediately mail an affidavit of 2 registration in duplicate, which affidavit shall contain the 3 following and such other information as the State Board of 4 Elections may think it proper to require for the 5 identification of the applicant:

6 Name. The name of the applicant, giving surname and 7 first or Christian name in full, and the middle name or the 8 initial for such middle name, if any.

Residence. The name and number of the street, avenue or 10 11 other location of the dwelling, and such additional clear and definite description as may be necessary to determine the 12 exact location of the dwelling of the applicant. 13 Where the location cannot be determined by street and number, then the 14 15 section, congressional township and range number may be used, 16 or such other information as may be necessary, including post office mailing address. 17

18 Term of residence in the State of Illinois and the 19 precinct.

20 Nativity. The state or country in which the applicant 21 was born.

22 Citizenship. Whether the applicant is native born or 23 naturalized. If naturalized, the court, place and date of 24 naturalization.

25 Age. Date of birth, by month, day and year.

There shall be no registration at the office of the board of 28 election 29 commissioners in cities, villages and incorporated towns of fewer than 200,000 inhabitants during the 28 days preceding 30 31 any primary, regular or special election at which the cards provided for in this Article are used, or until the second 32 33 day following such primary, regular or special election. In

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1 cities, villages and incorporated towns of 200,000 or more 2 inhabitants, there shall be no registration of voters at the office of the board of election commissioners during the 35 3 4 days immediately preceding any election; provided, however, where no precinct registration is being conducted prior to 5 6 any election then registration may be taken in the office of 7 the board up to and including the 29th day prior to such In any election called for the submission of the 8 election. 9 revision or alteration of, or the amendments to the Constitution, submitted by a Constitutional Convention, the 10 11 final day for registration at the office of the election authority charged with the printing of the ballot of this 12 13 election shall be the 15th day prior to the date of election. The board shall provide for precinct registration on 14 election day. A person registering on election day must be a 15

16 resident of the precinct in which he or she registers.

The Board of Election Commissioners shall appoint one or 17 more registration teams, each consisting of one member from 18 19 each of the 2 leading political parties, for the purpose of accepting the registration of any voter who files 20 an affidavit, within the period for taking registrations 21 provided for in this Article, that he is physically unable to 22 23 appear at the office of the Board or at any appointed place On the day or days when a precinct 24 of registration. 25 registration is being conducted such teams shall consist of one member from each of the 2 leading political parties who 26 are serving on the precinct registration board. Each team so 27 designated shall visit each disabled person and shall accept 28 29 the registration of such person the same as if he had applied 30 for registration in person.

The office of the board of election commissioners may be designated as a place of registration under Section 6-51 of this Article and, if so designated, may also be open for purposes of registration on such day or days as may be

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specified by the board of election commissioners under the
 provisions of that Section.
