AN ACT concerning property tax relief and pharmaceutical
 assistance.

3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,4 represented in the General Assembly:

5 Section 5. The Senior Citizens and Disabled Persons 6 Property Tax Relief and Pharmaceutical Assistance Act is 7 amended by changing the title and Sections 1, 2, 3.15, 4, and 8 9 as follows:

9 (320 ILCS 25/Act title)

10 An Act in relation to the payment of grants to enable 11 <u>Illinois residents</u> the-elderly-and-the-disabled to acquire or 12 retain private housing and to acquire prescription drugs.

Sec. 1. Short title. This Article shall-be-known-and may be cited as the <u>Working Families Circuit Breaker</u> "Senior Citizens--and--Disabled--Persons--Property--Tax--Relief and Pharmaceutical Assistance Act". As used in this Article, "this Act" means this Article.

21 Sec. 2. Purpose. The purpose of this Act is to provide incentives to <u>citizens</u> the--senior--eitizens--and-disabled 22 persons of this State to acquire and retain private housing 23 of their choice and at the same time to relieve those 24 citizens from the burdens of extraordinary property taxes 25 against their increasingly restricted earning power, and 26 thereby to reduce the requirements for public housing in this 27 28 State.

"Covered prescription drug" means (1) any cardiovascular agent or drug; (2) any insulin or other 3 4 prescription drug used in the treatment of diabetes, including syringe and needles used to administer the insulin; 5 6 (3) any prescription drug used in the treatment of arthritis, (4) beginning on January 1, 2001, any prescription drug used 7 in the treatment of cancer, (5) beginning on January 1, 2001, 8 9 any prescription drug used in the treatment of Alzheimer's disease, (6) beginning on January 1, 2001, any prescription 10 11 drug used in the treatment of Parkinson's disease, (7) beginning on January 1, 2001, any prescription drug used in 12 the treatment of glaucoma, and (8) beginning on January 1, 13 2001, any prescription drug used in the treatment of lung 14 disease and smoking related illnesses, (9) beginning on 15 16 January 1, 2002, any prescription drug used in the treatment of osteoporosis, (10) beginning on January 1, 2002, any 17 prescription drug used in the treatment of clinical 18 depression, (11) beginning on January 1, 2002, any 19 prescription drug used in the treatment of multiple 20 sclerosis, (12) beginning on January 1, 2002, any 21 22 prescription drug used in the treatment of bi-polar disorder, (13) beginning on January 1, 2002, any prescription drug used 23 in the treatment of schizophrenia, (14) beginning on January 24 1, 2002, any prescription drug used in the treatment of 25 lupus, (15) beginning on January 1, 2002, any prescription 26 drug used in the treatment of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis 27 (ALS), and (16) beginning on January 1, 2002, any 28 prescription drug used in the treatment of gastrointestinal 29 30 The specific agents or products to be included <u>disease</u>. under such categories shall be listed in a handbook to be 31 32 and distributed by the Department. 7 (a) In general. Any individual 65-years-or-older-or-any 8 individual-who-will-become-65-years-old-during--the--calendar 9 year--in--which-a-claim-is-filed,-and-any-surviving-spouse-of 10 such-a-claimant,-who-at-the-time-of--death--received--or--was 11 entitled--to--receive-a-grant-pursuant-to-this-Section,-which 12 surviving-spouse-will-become-65-years-of-age--within--the--24 months--immediately--following-the-death-of-such-claimant-and 13 14 which-surviving-spouse-but-for-his-or-her--age--is--otherwise 15 qualified--to--receive--a-grant-pursuant-to-this-Section,-and any-disabled-person whose annual household income is less 16 17 than \$14,000 for grant years before the 1998 grant year, less 18 than \$16,000 for the 1998 and 1999 grant years, and less than (i) \$21,218 for a household containing one person, (ii) 19 20 \$28,480 for a household containing 2 persons, or (iii) 21 \$35,740 for a household containing 3 or more persons for the 22 2000 grant year, and less than (i) 25,000 for a household containing one person, (ii) \$28,000 for a household 23 containing 2 persons, or (iii) \$30,000 for a household 24 25 containing 3 or more persons for the 2001 grant year and 26 thereafter and whose household is liable for payment of property taxes accrued or has paid rent constituting property 27 28 taxes accrued and is domiciled in this State at the time he files his or her claim is entitled to claim a grant under 29 30 this Act. With--respect--to-claims-filed-by-individuals-who will-become-65-years-old-during-the-calendar-year-in-which--a 31 32 elaim--is--filed,--the--amount--of--any--grant--to-which-that 33 household-is-entitled-shall-be-an-amount-equal-to-1/12-of-the

1 amount-to-which-the-claimant-would-otherwise-be--entitled--as 2 provided--in-this-Section,-multiplied-by-the-number-of-months 3 in-which-the-claimant-was-65-in-the-calendar--year--in--which 4 the-claim-is-filed.

5 (b) Limitation. Except as otherwise provided in 6 subsections (a) and (f) of this Section, the maximum amount 7 grant which a claimant is entitled to claim is the amount of 8 by which the property taxes accrued which were paid or 9 payable during the last preceding tax year or rent constituting property taxes accrued upon the claimant's 10 11 residence for the last preceding taxable year exceeds 3 1/2% of the claimant's household income for that year but in no 12 event is the grant to exceed (i) \$700 less 4.5% of household 13 income for that year for those with a household income of 14 15 \$14,000 or less or (ii) \$70 if household income for that year 16 is more than \$14,000.

(c) Public aid recipients. If household income 17 in one more months during a year includes cash assistance in 18 or 19 excess of \$55 per month from the Department of Public Aid or the Department of Human Services (acting as successor to the 20 21 Department of Public Aid under the Department of Human 22 Services Act) which was determined under regulations of that 23 Department on a measure of need that included an allowance for actual rent or property taxes paid by the recipient of 24 25 that assistance, the amount of grant to which that household 26 is entitled, except as otherwise provided in subsection (a), 27 shall be the product of (1) the maximum amount computed as specified in subsection (b) of this Section and (2) the ratio 28 29 of the number of months in which household income did not 30 include such cash assistance over \$55 to the number twelve. If household income did not include such cash assistance over 31 32 \$55 for any months during the year, the amount of the grant to which the household is entitled shall be the maximum 33 34 amount computed as specified in subsection (b) of this

Section. For purposes of this paragraph (c), "cash
 assistance" does not include any amount received under the
 federal Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program.

4 Joint ownership. If title to the residence is held (d) 5 jointly by the claimant with a person who is not a member of his household, the amount of property taxes accrued used in 6 7 computing the amount of grant to which he is entitled shall 8 be the same percentage of property taxes accrued as is the 9 percentage of ownership held by the claimant in the residence. 10

11 (e) More than one residence. If a claimant has occupied 12 more than one residence in the taxable year, he may claim 13 only one residence for any part of a month. In the case of property taxes accrued, he shall pro rate 1/12 of the total 14 15 property taxes accrued on his residence to each month that he 16 owned and occupied that residence; and, in the case of rent constituting property taxes accrued, shall pro rate each 17 18 month's rent payments to the residence actually occupied 19 during that month.

20 (f) There is hereby established а program of pharmaceutical assistance to--the--aged--and-disabled which 21 22 shall be administered by the Department in accordance with 23 this Act, to consist of payments to authorized pharmacies, on behalf of beneficiaries of the program, for the reasonable 24 25 costs of covered prescription drugs. Each beneficiary who pays \$5 for an identification card shall pay no additional 26 prescription costs. Each beneficiary who pays 27 \$25 for an identification card shall pay \$3 per prescription. 28 Τn 29 addition, after a beneficiary receives \$2,000 in benefits 30 during a State fiscal year, that beneficiary shall also be charged 20% of the cost of each prescription for which 31 32 payments are made by the program during the remainder of the 33 fiscal year. To become a beneficiary under this program a 34 person must be: (1) be (i)-65-years-or--older,--or--(ii)--the

In addition, 18 each 19 eligible person must (1) obtain an identification card from the Department, (2) at the time the card is obtained, sign a 20 21 statement assigning to the State of Illinois benefits which 22 may be otherwise claimed under any private insurance plans, 23 present the identification card to the dispensing (3) 24 pharmacist.

25 Whenever a generic equivalent for a covered prescription 26 drug is available, the Department shall reimburse only for 27 the reasonable costs of the generic equivalent, less the co-pay established in this Section, unless (i) the covered 28 29 prescription drug contains one or more ingredients defined as 30 a narrow therapeutic index drug at 21 CFR 320.33, (ii) the prescriber indicates on the face of the prescription "brand 31 32 medically necessary", and (iii) the prescriber specifies that a substitution is not permitted. 33 When issuing an oral 34 prescription for covered prescription medication described in

1 item (i) of this paragraph, the prescriber shall stipulate 2 "brand medically necessary" and that a substitution is not If the covered prescription drug and its 3 permitted. 4 authorizing prescription do not meet the criteria listed 5 the beneficiary may purchase the non-generic above, 6 equivalent of the covered prescription drug by paying the 7 difference between the generic cost and the non-generic cost 8 plus the beneficiary co-pay.

9 Any person otherwise eligible for pharmaceutical assistance under this Act whose covered drugs are covered by 10 11 any public program for assistance in purchasing any covered prescription drugs shall be ineligible for assistance under 12 this Act to the extent such costs are covered by such other 13 14 plan.

15 The fee to be charged by the Department for the 16 identification card shall be equal to \$5 for persons below 17 the official poverty line as defined by the United States 18 Department of Health and Human Services and \$25 for all other 19 persons.

In the event that 2 or more persons are eligible for any 20 21 benefit under this Act, and are members of the same household, (1) each such person shall be entitled 22 to 23 participate in the pharmaceutical assistance program, provided that he or she meets all other requirements imposed 24 25 by this subsection and (2) each participating household member contributes the fee required for that person by the 26 27 preceding paragraph for the purpose of obtaining an identification card. 28

32 Sec. 9. Any person who files a fraudulent claim for a
33 grant under this Act, or who for compensation prepares a

claim for a grant and knowingly enters false information on a 1 2 form for any claimant under this Act, or who claim fraudulently files multiple claim forms, or-who--fraudulently 3 4 states --- that -- a -- nondisabled -- person -- is -- disabled, or who 5 fraudulently procures а pharmaceutical assistance 6 identification card, or who fraudulently uses such card to 7 procure covered prescription drugs, or who, on behalf of an authorized pharmacy, files a fraudulent claim for payment, is 8 9 guilty of a Class 4 felony for the first offense and is guilty of a Class 3 felony for each subsequent offense. The 10 11 Department shall immediately suspend the use of the pharmaceutical assistance identification card of any person 12 suspected of fraudulent procurement or fraudulent use of such 13 card, and shall revoke such card upon a conviction. A person 14 15 convicted of such fraud shall be permanently barred from the 16 program of pharmaceutical assistance established under this Act. The Department may recover from a claimant, including an 17 18 authorized pharmacy, any amount paid under this Act on 19 account of an erroneous or fraudulent claim, together with 6% interest per year. A prosecution for a violation of this 20 21 Section may be commenced at any time within 3 years of the 22 commission of that violation.
