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AN ACT in relation to alcohol liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by 5 changing Section 6-15 as follows:

6 (235 ILCS 5/6-15) (from Ch. 43, par. 130)

Sec. 6-15. No alcoholic liquors shall be sold 7 or 8 delivered in any building belonging to or under the control of the State or any political subdivision thereof except as 9 provided in this Act. The corporate authorities of any city, 10 incorporated town or township may provide by 11 village, ordinance, however, that alcoholic liquor may be sold or 12 13 delivered in any specifically designated building belonging to or under the control of the municipality or township, or 14 15 in any building located on land under the control of the 16 municipality; provided that such township complies with all applicable local ordinances in any incorporated area of the 17 18 township. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at 19 any airport belonging to or under the control of a municipality of more than 25,000 inhabitants, or in any 20 building owned by a park district organized under the Park 21 22 District Code, subject to the approval of the governing board of the district, or in any building or on any golf course 23 owned by a forest preserve district organized under the 24 25 Downstate Forest Preserve District Act, subject to the approval of the governing board of the district, or on 26 the 27 grounds within 500 feet of any building owned by a forest preserve district organized under the Downstate Forest 28 29 Preserve District Act during times when food is dispensed for consumption within 500 feet of the building from which the 30 food is dispensed, subject to the approval of the governing 31

1 board of the district, or in a building owned by a Local Mass 2 Transit District organized under the Local Mass Transit District Act, subject to the approval of the governing Board 3 4 of the District, or in Bicentennial Park, or on the premises of the City of Mendota Lake Park located adjacent to Route 51 5 in Mendota, Illinois, or on the premises of Camden Park in 6 7 Milan, Illinois, or in the community center owned by the City of Loves Park that is located at 1000 River Park Drive in 8 Loves Park, Illinois, or, in connection with the operation of 9 an established food serving facility during times when food 10 11 is dispensed for consumption on the premises, and at the 12 following aquarium and museums located in public parks: Art Institute of Chicago, Chicago Academy of Sciences, Chicago 13 Historical Society, Field Museum of Natural History, Museum 14 15 of Science and Industry, DuSable Museum of African American 16 History, John G. Shedd Aquarium and Adler Planetarium, or at Lakeview Museum of Arts and Sciences in Peoria, or in 17 connection with the operation of the facilities of the 18 Chicago Zoological Society or the Chicago Horticultural 19 20 Society on land owned by the Forest Preserve District of Cook 21 County, or in any building located on land owned by the 22 Chicago Park District if approved by the Park District 23 Commissioners, or on any land used for a golf course or for recreational purposes and owned by the Illinois International 24 25 Port District if approved by the District's governing board, or at any airport, golf course, faculty center, or facility 26 in which conference and convention type activities take place 27 belonging to or under control of any State university or 28 29 public community college district, provided that with respect 30 to a facility for conference and convention type activities alcoholic liquors shall be limited to the use of the 31 convention or conference participants or participants in 32 cultural, political or educational activities held in such 33 34 facilities, and provided further that the faculty or staff of

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1 the State university or a public community college district, 2 or members of an organization of students, alumni, faculty or staff of the State university or a public community college 3 4 district are active participants in the conference or 5 convention, or by a catering establishment which has rented 6 facilities from a board of trustees of a public community 7 college district, or, if approved by the District board, on land owned by the Metropolitan Sanitary District of Greater 8 9 Chicago and leased to others for a term of at least 20 years. Nothing in this Section precludes the sale or delivery of 10 11 alcoholic liquor in the form of original packaged goods in premises located at 500 S. Racine in Chicago belonging to the 12 University of Illinois and used primarily as a grocery store 13 by a commercial tenant during the term of a lease that 14 predates the University's acquisition of the premises; but 15 16 the University shall have no power or authority to renew, transfer, or extend the lease with terms allowing the sale of 17 alcoholic liquor; and the sale of alcoholic liquor shall be 18 19 subject to all local laws and regulations. After the acquisition by Winnebago County of the property located at 20 404 Elm Street in Rockford, a commercial tenant who sold 21 22 alcoholic liquor at retail on a portion of the property under 23 a valid license at the time of the acquisition may continue to do so for so long as the tenant and the County may agree 24 25 under existing or future leases, subject to all local laws and regulations regarding the sale of alcoholic liquor. 26 Each facility shall provide dram shop liability in 27 maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save harmless the State, 28 29 municipality, State university, airport, golf course, faculty 30 center, facility in which conference and convention type take place, park district, Forest Preserve 31 activities 32 District, public community college district, aquarium, museum, or sanitary district from all financial loss, damage 33 34 or harm. Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings

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1 of golf courses owned by municipalities in connection with 2 the operation of an established food serving facility during times when food is dispensed for consumption upon the 3 4 premises. Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail in any building owned by a fire protection district 5 organized under the Fire Protection District Act, provided 6 7 that such delivery and sale is approved by the board of trustees of the district, and provided further that such 8 9 delivery and sale is limited to fundraising events and to a maximum of 6 events per year. 10

11 Alcoholic liquor may be delivered to and sold at retail in the Dorchester Senior Business Center owned by the Village 12 of Dolton if the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only 13 in connection with organized functions for which the planned 14 attendance is 20 or more persons, and if the person or 15 16 facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so 17 as to hold harmless the Village of Dolton and the State from 18 19 all financial loss, damage and harm.

20 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail 21 in any building used as an Illinois State Armory provided:

(i) the Adjutant General's written consent to the
issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such
building is filed with the Commission;

25 (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only 26 in connection with organized functions held on special 27 occasions;

(iii) the organized function is one for which the
planned attendance is 25 or more persons; and

30 (iv) the facility selling or dispensing the 31 alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability 32 insurance in maximum limits so as to save harmless the 33 facility and the State from all financial loss, damage or 34 harm.

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Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail
 in the Chicago Civic Center, provided that:

3 (i) the written consent of the Public Building
4 Commission which administers the Chicago Civic Center is
5 filed with the Commission;

6 (ii) the alcoholic liquor is sold or dispensed only 7 in connection with organized functions held on special 8 occasions;

9 (iii) the organized function is one for which the
10 planned attendance is 25 or more persons;

(iv) the facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquors has provided dram shop liability insurance in maximum limits so as to hold harmless the Civic Center, the City of Chicago and the State from all financial loss, damage or harm; and

16 (v) all applicable local ordinances are complied 17 with.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered or sold 18 in anv building belonging to or under the control of any city, 19 village or incorporated town where more than 75% of the 20 21 physical properties of the building is used for commercial or 22 recreational purposes, and the building is located upon a 23 pier extending into or over the waters of a navigable lake or stream or on the shore of a navigable lake or stream. 24 25 Alcoholic liquor may be sold in buildings under the control of the Department of Natural Resources when written consent 26 to the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic liquor in such 27 buildings is filed with the Commission by the Department of 28 Natural Resources. Alcoholic liquor may be served or 29 30 delivered in buildings and facilities under the control of 31 the Department of Natural Resources upon the written approval 32 of the Director of Natural Resources acting as the controlling government authority. The Director of Natural 33 Resources may specify conditions on that approval, including 34

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1 but not limited to requirements for insurance and hours of 2 operation. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, alcoholic liquor sold by a United States Army Corps of 3 4 Engineers or Department of Natural Resources concessionaire 5 who was operating on June 1, 1991 for on-premises consumption 6 only is not subject to the provisions of Articles IV and IX. 7 Beer and wine may be sold on the premises of the Joliet Park District Stadium owned by the Joliet Park District when 8 9 written consent to the issuance of a license to sell beer and wine in such premises is filed with the local liquor 10 11 commissioner by the Joliet Park District. Beer and wine may be sold in buildings on the grounds of State veterans' homes 12 when written consent to the issuance of a license to sell 13 beer and wine in such buildings is filed with the Commission 14 15 by the Department of Veterans' Affairs, and the facility 16 shall provide dram shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits so as to save the facility harmless from all 17 18 financial loss, damage or harm. Such liquors may be delivered 19 to and sold at any property owned or held under lease by a Metropolitan Pier and Exposition Authority or Metropolitan 20 21 Exposition and Auditorium Authority.

22 Beer and wine may be sold and dispensed at professional 23 sporting events and at professional concerts and other entertainment events conducted on premises owned by the 24 25 Forest Preserve District of Kane County, subject to the control of the District Commissioners and applicable local 26 law, provided that dram shop liability insurance is provided 27 at maximum coverage limits so as to hold the District 28 harmless from all financial loss, damage and harm. 29

30 Nothing in this Section shall preclude the sale or 31 delivery of beer and wine at a State or county fair or the 32 sale or delivery of beer or wine at a city fair in any 33 otherwise lawful manner.

34 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in

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State parks under the control of the Department of Natural
 Resources, provided:

a. the State park has overnight lodging facilities
with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight
lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve
complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,

b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell
alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with
the commission by the Department of Natural Resources,
and

11 c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the State park 12 lodge or restaurant concessionaire only during the hours o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight. 13 from 11 Notwithstanding any other provision of this 14 Act, 15 alcoholic liquor sold by the State park or restaurant 16 concessionaire is not subject to the provisions of Articles IV and IX. 17

18 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings on 19 properties under the control of the Historic Preservation 20 Agency provided:

a. the property has overnight lodging facilities
with some restaurant facilities or, not having overnight
lodging facilities, has restaurant facilities which serve
complete luncheon and dinner or supper meals,

25 b. consent to the issuance of a license to sell 26 alcoholic liquors in the buildings has been filed with 27 the commission by the Historic Preservation Agency, and

c. the alcoholic liquors are sold by the lodge or
restaurant concessionaire only during the hours from 11
o'clock a.m. until 12 o'clock midnight.

The sale of alcoholic liquors pursuant to this Section does not authorize the establishment and operation of facilities commonly called taverns, saloons, bars, cocktail lounges, and the like except as a part of lodge and

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restaurant facilities in State parks or golf courses owned by
 Forest Preserve Districts with a population of less than
 3,000,000 or municipalities or park districts.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in the
Springfield Administration Building of the Department of
Transportation and the Illinois State Armory in Springfield;
provided, that the controlling government authority may
consent to such sales only if

9 a. the request is from a not-for-profit 10 organization;

b. such sales would not impede normal operations ofthe departments involved;

13 c. the not-for-profit organization provides dram 14 shop liability in maximum insurance coverage limits and 15 agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State 16 of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm;

17d. no such sale shall be made during normal working18hours of the State of Illinois; and

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e. the consent is in writing.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail in buildings in recreational areas of river conservancy districts under the control of, or leased from, the river conservancy districts. Such sales are subject to reasonable local regulations as provided in Article IV; however, no such regulations may prohibit or substantially impair the sale of alcoholic liquors on Sundays or Holidays.

Alcoholic liquors may be provided in long term care 27 facilities owned or operated by a county under Division 5-21 28 29 or 5-22 of the Counties Code, when approved by the facility 30 operator and not in conflict with the regulations of the Illinois Department of Public Health, to residents of the 31 32 facility who have had their consumption of the alcoholic liquors provided approved in writing by a physician licensed 33 to practice medicine in all its branches. 34

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1 Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and dispensed in 2 State housing assigned to employees of the Department of 3 Corrections. No person shall furnish or allow to be furnished 4 any alcoholic liquors to any prisoner confined in any jail, 5 reformatory, prison or house of correction except upon a 6 physician's prescription for medicinal purposes.

7 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at the Willard Ice Building in Springfield, at the State Library 8 9 in Springfield, and at Illinois State Museum facilities by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or 10 11 executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the 12 controlling government authority, or by (2) a not-for-profit 13 organization, provided that such organization: 14

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a. Obtains written consent from the controlling government authority;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a
manner that does not impair normal operations of State
offices located in the building;

20 c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in
21 connection with an official activity in the building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at authorized functions.

32 The controlling government authority for the Willard Ice 33 Building in Springfield shall be the Director of the 34 Department of Revenue. The controlling government authority

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for Illinois State Museum facilities shall be the Director of
 the Illinois State Museum. The controlling government
 authority for the State Library in Springfield shall be the
 Secretary of State.

Alcoholic liquors may be delivered to and sold at retail 5 6 or dispensed at any facility, property or building under the 7 jurisdiction of the Historic Preservation Agency where the 8 delivery, sale or dispensing is by (1) an agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided 9 that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or 10 11 dispense alcoholic liquors from a controlling government authority, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization provided 12 that such organization: 13

a. Obtains written consent from the controllinggovernment authority;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a manner that does not impair normal workings of State offices or operations located at the facility, property or building;

20 c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in 21 connection with an official activity of the 22 not-for-profit organization in the facility, property or 23 building;

24 d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram 25 shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and 26 in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and 27 indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss, 28 damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing 29 of alcoholic liquors.

30 The controlling government authority for the Historic 31 Preservation Agency shall be the Director of the Historic 32 Preservation Agency.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed atthe James R. Thompson Center in Chicago and 222 South College

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1 Street in Springfield, Illinois by (1) a commercial tenant or 2 subtenant conducting business on the premises under a lease made pursuant to Section 405-315 of the Department of Central 3 4 Management Services Law (20 ILCS 405/405-315), provided that such tenant or subtenant who sells or dispenses alcoholic 5 6 liquors shall procure and maintain dram shop liability 7 insurance in maximum coverage limits and in which the carrier 8 agrees to defend, indemnify and save harmless the State of 9 Illinois from all financial loss, damage or harm arising out of the sale or dispensing of alcoholic liquors, or by (2) an 10 11 agency of the State, whether legislative, judicial or 12 executive, provided that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or dispense alcoholic liquors from the 13 of Central Management Services, or by (3) a 14 Director not-for-profit organization, provided that such organization: 15

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a. Obtains written consent from the Department of Central Management Services;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a
manner that does not impair normal operations of State
offices located in the building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in
 connection with an official activity in the building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram
shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and
in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and
indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing
of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Director of Central Management Services.

34 Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered at any

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1 facility owned by the Illinois Sports Facilities Authority 2 provided that dram shop liability insurance has been made 3 available in a form, with such coverage and in such amounts 4 as the Authority reasonably determines is necessary.

5 Alcoholic liquors may be sold at retail or dispensed at 6 the Rockford State Office Building by (1) an agency of the 7 State, whether legislative, judicial or executive, provided 8 that such agency first obtains written permission to sell or 9 dispense alcoholic liquors from the Department of Central 10 Management Services, or by (2) a not-for-profit organization, 11 provided that such organization:

12 a. Obtains written consent from the Department of13 Central Management Services;

b. Sells or dispenses the alcoholic liquors in a
manner that does not impair normal operations of State
offices located in the building;

c. Sells or dispenses alcoholic liquors only in
 connection with an official activity in the building;

d. Provides, or its catering service provides, dram
shop liability insurance in maximum coverage limits and
in which the carrier agrees to defend, save harmless and
indemnify the State of Illinois from all financial loss,
damage or harm arising out of the selling or dispensing
of alcoholic liquors.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent a not-for-profit organization or agency of the State from employing the services of a catering establishment for the selling or dispensing of alcoholic liquors at functions authorized by the Department of Central Management Services.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county in the City of Bloomington, and used by the McLean County Historical Society if the sale or delivery is approved by an ordinance adopted by the county board, and the

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1 municipality in which the building is located may not 2 prohibit that sale or delivery, notwithstanding any other provision of this Section. The regulation of the sale and 3 4 delivery of alcoholic liquor in a building that is owned by McLean County, situated on land owned by the county, and used 5 6 by the McLean County Historical Society as provided in this 7 paragraph is an exclusive power and function of the State and 8 is a denial and limitation under Article VII, Section 6, 9 subsection (h) of the Illinois Constitution of the power of a home rule municipality to regulate that sale and delivery. 10

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in any building situated on land held in trust for any school district organized under Article 34 of the School Code, if the building is not used for school purposes and if the sale or delivery is approved by the board of education.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in buildings owned by the Community Building Complex Committee of Boone County, Illinois if the person or facility selling or dispensing the alcoholic liquor has provided dram shop liability insurance with coverage and in amounts that the Committee reasonably determines are necessary.

Alcoholic liquors may be sold or delivered in the building located at 1200 Centerville Avenue in Belleville, Illinois and occupied by either the Belleville Area Special Education District or the Belleville Area Special Services Cooperative.
