AN ACT concerning health care benefit information cards.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
Uniform Health Care Service Benefits Information Card Act.

б Section 5. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the legislature to lessen patients' waiting times, decrease 7 8 administrative burdens for health care professionals and health care institutions, and improve care to patients by 9 minimizing confusion, eliminating unnecessary paperwork, and 10 streamlining the administrative aspects of care paid for by 11 third-party payors. This Act shall be broadly applied and 12 13 interpreted to effectuate this purpose.

14 Section 10. Definitions. As used in this Act, the 15 following terms have the meanings given in this Section.

16 "Department" means the Department of Insurance.

17 "Director" means the Director of Insurance.

18 "Health benefit plan" means an accident and health 19 insurance policy or certificate subject to the Illinois Insurance Code, a voluntary health services plan subject to 20 21 the Voluntary Health Services Plans Act, a health maintenance organization subscriber contract subject to the Health 22 Maintenance Organization Act, a plan provided by a multiple 23 employer welfare arrangement, or a plan provided by another 24 25 benefit arrangement. Without limitation, "health benefit plan" does not mean any of the following types of insurance: 26

- (1) accident;

(3) disability income;

30 (4) long-term or nursing home care;

1 2 (5) specified disease;

(6) dental or vision;

3 (7) coverage issued as a supplement to liability
4 insurance;

5 (8) medical payments under automobile or 6 homeowners;

7 (9) insurance under which benefits are payable with 8 or without regard to fault as statutorily required to be 9 contained in any liability policy or equivalent 10 self-insurance;

11 (10) hospital income or indemnity; and

12 (11) self-insured health benefit plans under the13 federal Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974.

14 Section 15. Uniform health care benefit information 15 cards required.

(a) A health benefit plan that issues a card or other 16 17 technology and provides coverage for health care services 18 including prescription drugs or devices also referred to as health care benefits and an administrator of such a plan 19 including, but not limited to, third-party administrators for 20 self-insured plans and state-administered plans shall issue 21 22 to its insureds a card or other technology containing uniform health care benefit information. The health care benefit 23 24 information card or other technology shall specifically identify and display the following mandatory data elements on 25 the card: 26

27 (1) processor control number, if required for28 claims adjudication;

(2) group number;

(3) card issuer identifier;

(5) cardholder name.

other technology shall specifically identify and display the
 following mandatory data elements on the back of the card:

3 (1) claims submission names and addresses; and 4 (2) help desk telephone numbers and names

(2) help desk telephone numbers and names and website addresses, if available.

6 (c) A new uniform health care benefit information card 7 or other technology shall be issued by a health benefit plan 8 upon enrollment and reissued upon any change in the insured's 9 coverage that affects mandatory data elements contained on 10 the card.

Section 20. Applicability and enforcement.

12 (a) This Act applies to health care benefit plans that 13 are amended, delivered, issued, or renewed on and after the 14 effective date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General 15 Assembly.

(b) The Director may adopt rules necessary to implement 16 17 the Department's responsibilities under this Act. To enforce the provisions of this Act, the Director may issue a cease 18 and desist order or require a health benefit plan to submit a 19 plan of correction for violations of this Act, or both. 20 21 Subject to the provisions of the Illinois Administrative 22 Procedure Act, the Director may, pursuant to Section 403A of the Illinois Insurance Code, impose upon a health benefit 23 24 plan an administrative fine not to exceed \$250,000 for failure to submit a requested plan of correction, failure to 25 26 comply with its plan or correction, or repeated violations of 27 this Act.

28 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect on 29 January 1, 2002.
