- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Children and Family Services Act is
- 5 amended by adding Section 4b and by changing Section 35.5 as
- 6 follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 505/4b new)
- 8 <u>Sec. 4b. Required investigations. The Department must</u>
- 9 <u>investigate any complaint of alleged neglect or abuse to</u>
- 10 minors or group care residents ages 17 through 21 who are in

- 12 jurisdiction of the Department. In connection with the
- investigations required by this Section, the Department must

- 18 (a) The Governor shall appoint, and the Senate shall
- 19 confirm, an Inspector General who shall have the authority to
- 20 conduct investigations into allegations of or incidents of
- 21 possible misconduct, misfeasance, malfeasance, or violations
- of rules, procedures, or laws by any employee, foster parent,
- 23 service provider, or contractor of the Department of Children
- 24 and Family Services. The Inspector General is authorized to
- 25 <u>investigate any complaint of alleged neglect or abuse to</u>
- 26 minors or group care residents ages 17 through 21 who are in
- 27 <u>any home or child care institution licensed by or under the</u>
- 28 <u>jurisdiction of the Department.</u> The Inspector General shall

Any investigation conducted by the Inspector General shall be independent and separate from the 3 4 investigation mandated by the Abused and Neglected Child 5 Reporting Act. The Inspector General shall be appointed for 6 a term of 4 years. The Inspector General shall 7 independent of the operations of the Department and shall report to the Director of Children and Family 8 Services 9 the Governor and perform other duties the Director may designate. The Inspector General shall adopt rules as 10 11 necessary to carry out the functions, purposes, and duties of the office of Inspector General in the Department of Children 12 and Family Services, in accordance with 13 the Illinois Administrative Procedure Act and any other applicable law. 14
 - (b) The Inspector General shall have access to all information and personnel necessary to perform the duties of the office. To minimize duplication of efforts, and to assure consistency and conformance with the requirements and procedures established in the B.H. v. Suter consent decree and to share resources when appropriate, the Inspector General shall coordinate his or her activities with the Bureau of Quality Assurance within the Department.

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- (c) The Inspector General shall be the primary liaison between the Department and the Department of State Police with regard to investigations conducted under the Inspector General's auspices. If the Inspector General determines that a possible criminal act has been committed, or that special expertise is required in the investigation, he or she shall immediately notify the Department of State Police. All investigations conducted by the Inspector General shall be conducted in a manner designed to ensure the preservation of evidence for possible use in a criminal prosecution.
- 33 (d) The Inspector General may recommend to the 34 Department of Children and Family Services, the Department of

- 1 Public Health, or any other appropriate agency, sanctions to
- 2 imposed against service providers under the jurisdiction
- of or under contract with the Department for the protection 3
