- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 11-212 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/11-212 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 11-212. Traffic stop statistical study.</u>
- 8 (a) From June 1, 2001 until 4 years after the effective
- 9 <u>date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly,</u>
- 10 whenever a State law enforcement officer issues a uniform
- 11 <u>traffic citation or warning citation for an alleged violation</u>
- of the Illinois Vehicle Code, he or she shall record on the
- 13 <u>face of the citation in addition to other information the</u>
- 14 <u>following:</u>
- 15 <u>(1) the race of the motorist; and</u>
- 16 (2) whether there was a search of the vehicle,
- 17 <u>vehicle driver, or passenger resulting in no further</u>
- 18 <u>legal action.</u>
- 19 (b) From June 8, 2002 until 3 years after the effective
- 20 <u>date of this amendatory Act of the 92nd General Assembly, the</u>
- 21 <u>Director of State Police shall compile the data collected</u>
- 22 <u>under clauses (1) and (2) of subsection (a) and forward the</u>
- 23 <u>data to the Secretary of State.</u>
- (c) Upon receiving the data specified in subsection (b),
- 25 <u>the Secretary of State shall, by February 8 of each year</u>
