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AN ACT regarding vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
changing Sections 6-113 and 6-115 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/6-113) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-113)

7 Sec. 6-113. Restricted licenses and permits.

8 (a) The Secretary of State upon issuing a drivers license or permit shall have the authority whenever good 9 cause appears to impose restrictions suitable to 10 the licensee's driving ability with respect to the type of, or 11 special mechanical control devices required on, a motor 12 13 vehicle which the licensee may operate or such other restrictions applicable to the licensee as the Secretary of 14 State may determine to be appropriate to assure the safe 15 16 operation of a motor vehicle by the licensee.

17 (b) The Secretary of State may either issue a special 18 restricted license or permit or may set forth such 19 restrictions upon the usual license or permit form.

20 (c) The Secretary of State may issue a probationary license to a person whose driving privileges have been 21 22 suspended pursuant to subsection (d) of this Section or subsections (a)(2), (a)(19) and (a)(20) of Section 6-206 of 23 this Code. The Secretary of State shall promulgate rules 24 to The Illinois Administrative Procedure Act, 25 pursuant setting forth the conditions and criteria for the issuance 26 27 and cancellation of probationary licenses.

(d) The Secretary of State may upon receiving
satisfactory evidence of any violation of the restrictions of
such license or permit suspend, revoke or cancel the same
without preliminary hearing, but the licensee or permittee

shall be entitled to a hearing as in the case of a suspension
 or revocation.

3 (e) It is unlawful for any person to operate a motor 4 vehicle in any manner in violation of the restrictions 5 imposed on a restricted license or permit issued to him.

6 (f) Whenever the holder of a restricted driving permit 7 is issued a citation for any of the following offenses 8 including similar local ordinances, the restricted driving 9 permit is immediately invalidated:

Reckless homicide resulting from the operation
 of a motor vehicle;

Violation of Section 11-501 of this Act relating
 to the operation of a motor vehicle while under the
 influence of intoxicating liquor or narcotic drugs;

15 3. Violation of Section 11-401 of this Act relating
16 to the offense of leaving the scene of a traffic accident
17 involving death or injury; or

18 4. Violation of Section 11-504 of this Act relating19 to the offense of drag racing;

The police officer issuing the citation shall confiscate the restricted driving permit and forward it, along with the citation, to the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the county in which the citation was issued.

24 (g) The Secretary of State may issue a special 25 restricted license for a period of 12 months to individuals using vision aid arrangements other than standard eyeglasses 26 27 or contact lenses, allowing the operation of a motor vehicle during nighttime hours. The Secretary of State shall adopt 28 rules defining the terms and conditions by which the 29 30 individual may obtain and renew this special restricted 31 license. At a minimum, all drivers must meet the following <u>requirements:</u> 32

331. Possess a valid driver's license and have34operated a motor vehicle during daylight hours for a

15	Sec. 6-115. Expiration of driver's license.
16	(a) Except as provided elsewhere in this Section, every
17	driver's license issued under the provisions of this Code
18	shall expire 4 years from the date of its issuance, or at
19	such later date, as the Secretary of State may by proper rule
20	and regulation designate, not to exceed 12 calendar months;
21	in the event that an applicant for renewal of a driver's
22	license fails to apply prior to the expiration date of the
23	previous driver's license, the renewal driver's license shall
24	expire 4 years from the expiration date of the previous
25	driver's license, or at such later date as the Secretary of
26	State may by proper rule and regulation designate, not to
27	exceed 12 calendar months.
28	The Secretary of State may, however, issue to a person
29	not previously licensed as a driver in Illinois a driver's
30	license which will expire not less than 4 years nor more than
31	5 years from date of issuance, except as provided elsewhere

32 in this Section.

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The Secretary of State is authorized to issue driver's

1 licenses during the years 1984 through 1987 which shall 2 expire not less than 3 years nor more than 5 years from the date of issuance, except as provided elsewhere in this 3 4 Section, for the purpose of converting all driver's licenses 5 issued under this Code to a 4 year expiration. Provided that 6 all original driver's licenses, except as provided elsewhere 7 in this Section, shall expire not less than 4 years nor more than 5 years from the date of issuance. 8

9 Before the expiration of a driver's license, (b) except those licenses expiring on the individual's 21st birthday, or 10 11 3 months after the individual's 21st birthday, the holder thereof may apply for a renewal thereof, subject to all the 12 provisions of Section 6-103, and the Secretary of State may 13 require an examination of the applicant. A licensee whose 14 license expires on his 21st birthday, or 3 months 15 driver's 16 after his 21st birthday, may not apply for a renewal of his driving privileges until he reaches the age of 21. 17

18 (c) The Secretary of State shall, 30 days prior to the 19 expiration of a driver's license, forward to each person 20 whose license is to expire a notification of the expiration 21 of said license which may be presented at the time of renewal 22 of said license.

There may be included with such notification information explaining the anatomical gift and Emergency Medical Information Card provisions of Section 6-110. The format and text of such information shall be prescribed by the Secretary.

There shall be included with such notification, for a period of 4 years beginning January 1, 2000 information regarding the Illinois Adoption Registry and Medical Information Exchange established in Section 18.1 of the Adoption Act.

33 (d) The Secretary may defer the expiration of the34 driver's license of a licensee, spouse, and dependent

children who are living with such licensee while on active
 duty, serving in the Armed Forces of the United States
 outside of the State of Illinois, and 45 days thereafter,
 upon such terms and conditions as the Secretary may
 prescribe.

6 (e) The Secretary of State may decline to process a 7 renewal of a driver's license of any person who has not paid 8 any fee or tax due under this Code and is not paid upon 9 reasonable notice and demand.

(f) The Secretary shall provide that each original or 10 11 renewal driver's license issued to a licensee under 21 years of age shall expire 3 months after the licensee's 21st 12 birthday. Persons whose current driver's licenses expire on 13 their 21st birthday on or after January 1, 1986 shall not 14 renew their driver's license before their 21st birthday, and 15 16 their current driver's license will be extended for an additional term of 3 months beyond their 21st birthday. 17 Thereafter, the expiration and term of the driver's license 18 19 shall be governed by subsection (a) hereof.

20 (g) The Secretary shall provide that each original or 21 renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 81 years of age 22 through age 86 shall expire 2 years from the date of 23 issuance, or at such later date as the Secretary may by rule and regulation designate, not to exceed an additional 12 24 25 calendar months. The Secretary shall also provide that each original or renewal driver's license issued to a licensee 87 26 years of age or older shall expire 12 months from the date of 27 issuance, or at such later date as the Secretary may by rule 28 29 and regulation designate, not to exceed an additional 12 30 calendar months.

(h) The Secretary of State shall provide that each
 special restricted driver's license issued under subsection
 (g) of Section 6-113 of this Code shall expire 12 months from
 the date of issuance. The Secretary shall adopt rules
