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AN ACT in relation to vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 5 changing Sections 6-301.1 and 6-301.2 as follows:

6 (625 ILCS 5/6-301.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 6-301.1)
7 Sec. 6-301.1. Fictitious or unlawfully altered driver's
8 license or permit.

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(a) As used in this Section:

10 1. "A fictitious driver's license or permit" means 11 any issued license or permit for which a computerized 12 number and file have been created by the Secretary of 13 State or other official driver's license agency in 14 another jurisdiction which contains false information 15 concerning the identity of the individual issued the 16 license or permit;

17 2. "False information" means any information 18 concerning the name, sex, date of birth, social security 19 number or any photograph that falsifies all or in part 20 the actual identity of the individual issued the license 21 or permit;

22 3. "An unlawfully altered driver's license or permit" means any issued license or permit for which a 23 computerized number and file have been created by the 24 Secretary of State or other official driver's license 25 agency in another jurisdiction which has been physically 26 27 altered or changed in such a manner that false information appears upon the license or permit; 28

4. "A document capable of defrauding another"
includes, but is not limited to, any document by which
any right, obligation or power with reference to any

person or property may be created, transferred, altered
 or terminated;

5. "An identification document" means any document 3 4 made or issued by or under the authority of the United States Government, the State of Illinois or any other 5 state or political subdivision thereof, or any other 6 governmental or quasi-governmental organization which, 7 8 when completed with information concerning the 9 individual, is of a type intended or commonly accepted for the purpose of identification of an individual *j*-10

116. "Common carrier" means any public or private12provider of transportation, whether by land, air, or13water.

14 (b) It is a violation of this Section for any person:

To knowingly possess any fictitious or
 unlawfully altered driver's license or permit;

17 2. To knowingly possess, display or cause to be 18 displayed any fictitious or unlawfully altered driver's 19 license or permit for the purpose of obtaining any 20 account, credit, credit card or debit card from a bank, 21 financial institution or retail mercantile establishment;

3. To knowingly possess any fictitious or unlawfully altered driver's license or permit with the intent to commit a theft, deception or credit or debit card fraud in violation of any law of this State or any law of any other jurisdiction;

4. To knowingly possess any fictitious or unlawfully altered driver's license or permit with the intent to commit any other violation of any law of this State or any law of any other jurisdiction for which a sentence to a term of imprisonment in a penitentiary for one year or more is provided;

33 5. To knowingly possess any fictitious or
 34 unlawfully altered driver's license or permit while in

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possession without authority of any document, instrument or device capable of defrauding another;

6. To knowingly possess any fictitious or unlawfully altered driver's license or permit with the intent to use the license or permit to acquire any other identification document;

7. To knowingly issue or assist in the issuance of any fictitious driver's license or permit;

9 8. To knowingly alter or attempt to alter any
10 driver's license or permit;

9. To knowingly manufacture, possess, transfer or provide any identification document whether real or fictitious for the purpose of obtaining a fictitious driver's license or permit*j*.

15 <u>10. To knowingly use any fictitious or unlawfully</u> 16 <u>altered driver's license or permit to purchase or attempt</u> 17 <u>to purchase any ticket for a common carrier or to board</u> 18 <u>or attempt to board any common carrier;</u>

19 <u>11. To knowingly possess any fictitious or</u> 20 <u>unlawfully altered driver's license or permit if the</u> 21 <u>person has at the time a different driver's license</u> 22 <u>issued by the Illinois Secretary of State or other</u> 23 <u>official driver's license agency in another jurisdiction</u> 24 <u>that is suspended or revoked.</u>

25 (c) Sentence.

Any person convicted of a violation of paragraph
 of subsection (b) of this Section shall be guilty of a
 Class A misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to minimum
 fine of \$500 or 50 hours of community service, preferably
 at an alcohol abuse prevention program, if available. A
 person convicted of a second or subsequent violation
 shall be guilty of a Class 4 felony.

33 2. Any person convicted of a violation of paragraph
34 3 of subsection (b) of this Section who at the time of

1 arrest had in his possession two or more fictitious or 2 unlawfully altered driver's licenses or permits shall be 3 guilty of a Class 4 felony.

Any person convicted of a violation of any of
paragraphs 2 through <u>11</u> 9 of subsection (b) of this
Section shall be guilty of a Class 4 felony. A person
convicted of a second or subsequent violation shall be
guilty of a Class 3 felony.

9 (d) This Section does not prohibit any lawfully 10 authorized investigative, protective, law enforcement or 11 other activity of any agency of the United States, State of 12 Illinois or any other state or political subdivision thereof. 13 (Source: P.A. 88-210.)

16 (a) (Blank).

17 (b) It is a violation of this Section for any person:
18 1. To knowingly possess any fraudulent driver's
19 license or permit;

20 2. To knowingly possess, display or cause to be 21 displayed any fraudulent driver's license or permit for 22 the purpose of obtaining any account, credit, credit card 23 or debit card from a bank, financial institution or 24 retail mercantile establishment;

3. To knowingly possess any fraudulent driver's license or permit with the intent to commit a theft, deception or credit or debit card fraud in violation of any law of this State or any law of any other jurisdiction;

30 4. To knowingly possess any fraudulent driver's
31 license or permit with the intent to commit any other
32 violation of any laws of this State or any law of any
33 other jurisdiction for which a sentence to a term of

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imprisonment in a penitentiary for one year or more is

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provided;

5. To knowingly possess any fraudulent driver's 3 4 license or permit while in unauthorized possession of any document, instrument or device capable of defrauding 5 another; 6 7 6. To knowingly possess any fraudulent driver's 8 license or permit with the intent to use the license or 9 permit to acquire any other identification document; 7. To knowingly possess without authority any 10 11 driver's license-making or permit-making implement; 8. To knowingly possess any stolen driver's 12 license-making or permit-making implement; 13 9. To knowingly duplicate, manufacture, sell or 14 15 transfer any fraudulent driver's license or permit; 16 10. To advertise or distribute any information or 17 materials that promote the selling, giving, or furnishing of a fraudulent driver's license or permit <u>i</u>. 18 19 11. To knowingly use any fraudulent driver's 20 license or permit to purchase or attempt to purchase any 21 ticket for a common carrier or to board or attempt to 22 board any common carrier. As used in this Section, 23 "common carrier" means any public or private provider of 24 transportation, whether by land, air, or water; 25 12. To knowingly possess any fraudulent driver's license or permit if the person has at the time a 26 different driver's license issued by the Secretary of 27 State or another official driver's license agency in 28 29 another jurisdiction that is suspended or revoked. 30 (c) Sentence. 1. Any person convicted of a violation of paragraph 31 1 of subsection (b) of this Section shall be guilty of a 32 Class 4 felony and shall be sentenced to a minimum fine 33 of \$500 or 50 hours of community service, preferably at 34

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an alcohol abuse prevention program, if available.

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Any person convicted of a violation of any of
 paragraphs 2 through 9 or paragraph 11 or 12 of
 subsection (b) of this Section shall be guilty of a Class
 4 felony. A person convicted of a second or subsequent
 violation shall be guilty of a Class 3 felony.

7 3. Any person convicted of a violation of paragraph
8 10 of subsection (b) of this Section shall be guilty of a
9 Class B misdemeanor.

(d) This Section does not prohibit any lawfully 10 11 authorized investigative, protective, law enforcement or other activity of any agency of the United States, State of 12 Illinois or any other state or political subdivision thereof. 13 (e) The Secretary may request the Attorney General to 14 seek a restraining order in the circuit court against any 15 person who violates this Section by advertising fraudulent 16 driver's licenses or permits. 17
