1 AN ACT to create the Drug Impaired Minor Responsibility

- 3 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 4 represented in the General Assembly:
- 5 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
- 6 Drug Impaired Minor Responsibility Act.
- 7 Section 5. Responsibility of person who supplies illegal
- 8 drugs to a person under 18 years of age. Any person at least
- 9 18 years of age who willfully supplies illegal drugs to a
- 10 person under 18 years of age and causes the impairment of
- 11 such person shall be liable for death or injuries to persons
- or property caused by the impairment of such person.
- 13 A person, or the survivor of any person, who is injured,
- in person or property, by an impaired person under the age of
- 15 18 has a right of action in his or her own name, jointly and
- 16 severally, for damages (including reasonable attorney's fees
- and expenses) against any person:
- 18 (i) who, by selling, giving or delivering illegal
- 19 drugs causes or contributes to the impairment of the
- 20 person under the age of 18; or
- 21 (ii) who, by permitting consumption of illegal
- drugs causes, or contributes to, the impairment of the
- person under the age of 18.
- 24 An action for damages under this Section is barred unless
- commenced within 2 years after the right of action arises.
- 26 Section 10. A person entitled to bring an action under
- 27 this Act may recover all of the following damages:
- 28 (1) economic damages, including, but not limited to,
- 29 the cost of treatment and rehabilitation, medical
- 30 expenses, loss of economic or educational potential, loss

of productivity, absenteeism, support expenses, accidents or injury and any other pecuniary loss proximately caused by the impairment of the person under the age of 18;

- (2) non-economic damages, including, but not limited to, physical and emotional pain, suffering, physical impairment, emotional distress, mental anguish, disfigurement, loss of enjoyment, loss of companionship, services, and consortium, and other non-pecuniary losses proximately caused by the impairment of the person under the age 18;
- (3) exemplary damages;

- (4) reasonable attorneys' fees;
- 13 (5) costs of suit, including, but not limited to,
  14 reasonable expenses for expert testimony; and
- 15 (6) punitive damages in an amount that is not less
  16 than treble the amount of economic and non-economic
  17 damages.
- 18 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
