- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Department of Public Health Powers and
- 5 Duties Law of the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is
- 6 amended by adding Section 2310-585 as follows:
- 7 (20 ILCS 2310/2310-585 new)
- 8 Sec. 2310-585. To inspect the premises of a retailer who
- 9 <u>sells alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises and</u>
- 10 to enforce the requirement that such retailers post signs as
- 11 required under Section 6-32 of the Liquor Control Act of
- 12 <u>1934.</u>
- 13 Section 10. The Liquor Control Act of 1934 is amended by
- 14 adding Section 6-32 as follow:
- 15 (235 ILCS 5/6-32 new)
- 16 <u>Sec. 6-32. Warning signs.</u>
- 17 <u>(a) A retailer who sells alcoholic beverages for</u>
- 18 <u>consumption on the premises shall post, in a conspicuous</u>
- 19 place, a sign that clearly reads: "Warning: Drinking
- 20 <u>alcoholic beverages during pregnancy can cause birth</u>
- 21 <u>defects." The sign shall include a picture, occupying not</u>
- 22 <u>less than one-half of the sign, illustrating a pregnant woman</u>
- 23 <u>and the international red "prohibited" symbol over an</u>
- 24 <u>alcoholic beverage. The illustration shall be no smaller than</u>
- 25 <u>11 inches by 17 inches.</u>
- 26 (b) The Department shall make such warning signs
- 27 <u>available to retailers of alcoholic beverages and shall</u>
- 28 promulgate rules with respect to the form and the posting of
- 29 <u>such signs</u>. A fee may be charged by the Department to cover

- 1 printing, postage, and handling expenses.
- 2 (c) A person who fails or refuses to post the sign as
- 3 required in this Section shall be guilty of a Class C
- 4 <u>misdemeanor</u>. A person who violates subsection (a) shall also
- 5 <u>be liable for a civil fine in an amount not to exceed \$150</u>
- 6 for the first violation or \$500 for a second violation or
- 7 <u>subsequent violation</u>. <u>Such fine shall be imposed and</u>
- 8 collected by the Department of Public Health after providing
- 9 the person with due process and an opportunity to be heard.
