- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Property Tax Code is amended by changing
- 5 Section 3-45 as follows:
- 6 (35 ILCS 200/3-45)
- 7 Sec. 3-45. Election of county assessor: counties of less
- 8 than 3,000,000. In counties having an elected board of review
- 9 under Section 6-35, a county assessor shall be elected. To be
- 10 eligible to file nomination papers or participate as a
- 11 <u>candidate in any primary or general election for, or be</u>
- 12 <u>elected to, the office of county assessor, or to enter upon</u>
- the duties of the office, a person must possess one of the
- 14 <u>following qualifications as certified by the individual to</u>
- 15 <u>the county clerk:</u>
- 16 <u>(1) a Certified Illinois Assessing Officer</u>
- 17 <u>certificate from the Illinois Property Assessment</u>

- from the International Association of Assessing Officers.
- 21 <u>In addition</u> elected-as-county-assessor, a person must have at
