- 4 <u>consequences</u>.
- 5 (a) A physician licensed under the Medical Practice Act
- 6 of 1987 who willfully fails to report an instance of
- 7 <u>suspected elder abuse or neglect as required under this Act</u>
- 8 <u>is subject to disciplinary action under Section 22 of the</u>
- 9 <u>Medical Practice Act of 1987.</u>
- 10 (b) As used in this subsection, "State funding" means
- 11 State moneys paid under Article V of the Illinois Public Aid
- 12 <u>Code or under any other law.</u>
- 13 <u>If a facility licensed under the Nursing Home Care Act</u>
