AN ACT in relation to vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by 5 changing Sections 12-205.1 and 12-215 as follows:

б (625 ILCS 5/12-205.1) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 12-205.1) Sec. 12-205.1. Implements of husbandry or slow-moving 7 8 vehicles-Display of amber signal lamp. Every animal drawn vehicle, farm tractor, implement of husbandry and special 9 mobile equipment, except when used for road construction or 10 maintenance within the limits of а construction 11 or maintenance project where traffic control devices are used in 12 13 compliance with the applicable provisions of the manual and specifications adopted under Section 11-301 of the 14 Illinois 15 Vehicle Code, when operated on a highway during a time when 16 lighted lamps are required by Section 12-201 of this Chapter, shall display to the rear at least one flashing amber signal 17 18 lamp mounted as high as practicable and of sufficient intensity to be visible for a distance of at least 500 feet 19 20 in normal sunlight; provided, that only the rearmost vehicle of a combination of vehicles coupled together need display 21 22 such lamp. The flashing amber signal lamp may be operated lighted during daylight hours when other lamps are not 23 required to be lighted when vehicles authorized in this 24 Section are operated on a highway. Implements of husbandry 25 manufactured on or after January 1, 26 2003 and operated on 27 public roads between sunset and sunrise shall display markings and lighting that meet or exceed the design, 28 29 performance, and mounting specifications adopted by the American Society of Agricultural Engineers and published by 30 that body as ASAE S279.11 APR01 S-279.10-APR98. 31

3 Sec. 12-215. Oscillating, rotating or flashing lights on
4 motor vehicles. Except as otherwise provided in this Code:

5 (a) The use of red or white oscillating, rotating or 6 flashing lights, whether lighted or unlighted, is prohibited 7 except on:

8 1. Law enforcement vehicles of State, Federal or
9 local authorities;

10 2. A vehicle operated by a police officer or county 11 coroner and designated or authorized by local 12 authorities, in writing, as a law enforcement vehicle; 13 however, such designation or authorization must be 14 carried in the vehicle;

15 3. Vehicles of local fire departments and State or16 federal firefighting vehicles;

4. Vehicles which are designed and used exclusively as ambulances or rescue vehicles; furthermore, such lights shall not be lighted except when responding to an emergency call for and while actually conveying the sick or injured;

5. Tow trucks licensed in a state that requires such lights; furthermore, such lights shall not be lighted on any such tow truck while the tow truck is operating in the State of Illinois; and

28 (b) The use of amber oscillating, rotating or flashing
29 lights, whether lighted or unlighted, is prohibited except
30 on:

 shall not be lighted except as required in this paragraph

1 1; such lights shall be lighted when such vehicles are 2 actually being used at the scene of an accident or disablement; if the towing vehicle is equipped with a 3 4 flat bed that supports all wheels of the vehicle being transported, the lights shall not be lighted while the 5 vehicle is engaged in towing on a highway; if the towing 6 7 vehicle is not equipped with a flat bed that supports all 8 wheels of a vehicle being transported, the lights shall 9 lighted while the towing vehicle is engaged in towing be on a highway during all times when the use of headlights 10 is required under Section 12-201 of this Code; 11

12 2. Motor vehicles or equipment of the State of
13 Illinois, local authorities and contractors; furthermore,
14 such lights shall not be lighted except while such
15 vehicles are engaged in maintenance or construction
16 operations within the limits of construction projects;

17 3. Vehicles or equipment used by engineering or
18 survey crews; furthermore, such lights shall not be
19 lighted except while such vehicles are actually engaged
20 in work on a highway;

4. Vehicles of public utilities, municipalities, or
other construction, maintenance or automotive service
vehicles except that such lights shall be lighted only as
a means for indicating the presence of a vehicular
traffic hazard requiring unusual care in approaching,
overtaking or passing while such vehicles are engaged in
maintenance, service or construction on a highway;

5. Oversized vehicle or load; however, such lights
shall only be lighted when moving under permit issued by
the Department under Section 15-301 of this Code;

31 6. The front and rear of motorized equipment owned
32 and operated by the State of Illinois or any political
33 subdivision thereof, which is designed and used for
34 removal of snow and ice from highways;

1 7. Fleet safety vehicles registered in another 2 state, furthermore, such lights shall not be lighted except as provided for in Section 12-212 of this Code; 3 4 8. Such other vehicles as may be authorized by local authorities; 5 9. Law enforcement vehicles of State or local 6 7 authorities when used in combination with red oscillating, rotating or flashing lights; 8 9 9.5. Propane delivery trucks; 10. Vehicles used for collecting or delivering mail 10 11 for the United States Postal Service provided that such lights shall not be lighted except when such vehicles are 12 actually being used for such purposes; 13 11. Any vehicle displaying a slow-moving vehicle 14 emblem as provided in Section 12-205.1; 15 16 12. All trucks equipped with self-compactors or roll-off hoists and roll-on containers for garbage or 17 refuse hauling. Such lights shall not be lighted except 18 when such vehicles are actually being used for such 19 20 purposes; 13. Vehicles used by a security company, alarm 21 22 responder, or control agency,-if--the--security--company, 23 alarm-responder,-or-control-agency-is-bound-by-a-contract with--a-federal,-State,-or-local-government-entity-to-use 24 25 the-lights; and 14. Security vehicles of the Department of Human 26 Services; however, the lights shall not be lighted except 27 when being used for security related purposes under the 28 direction of the superintendent of the facility where the 29 30 vehicle is located. (c) The use of blue oscillating, rotating or flashing 31

31 (c) The use of blue oscillating, rotating or flashing 32 lights, whether lighted or unlighted, is prohibited except 33 on:

1. Rescue squad vehicles not owned by a fire

1 department and vehicles owned or fully operated by a: 2 voluntary firefighter; paid firefighter; 3 4 part-paid firefighter; call firefighter; 5 member of the board of trustees of a fire 6 7 protection district; paid or unpaid member of a rescue squad; or 8 9 paid or unpaid member of a voluntary ambulance unit. 10 11 However, such lights are not to be lighted except when responding to a bona fide emergency. 12 2. Police department vehicles in cities having a 13 population of 500,000 or more inhabitants. 14 3. Law enforcement vehicles of State or local 15 16 authorities when used in combination with red oscillating, rotating or flashing lights. 17 4. Vehicles of local fire departments and State or 18 federal firefighting vehicles when used in combination 19 with red oscillating, rotating or flashing lights. 20 21 5. Vehicles which are designed and used exclusively as ambulances or rescue vehicles when used in combination 22 23 with red oscillating, rotating or flashing lights; furthermore, such lights shall not be lighted except when 24 25 responding to an emergency call. 6. Vehicles that are equipped and used exclusively 26 as organ transport vehicles when used in combination with 27 oscillating, rotating, or flashing lights; 28 red furthermore, these lights shall only be lighted when the 29 30 transportation is declared an emergency by a member of 31 the transplant team or a representative of the organ procurement organization. 32 7. Vehicles of the Illinois Emergency Management 33 Agency and vehicles of the Department of Nuclear Safety, 34

when used in combination with red oscillating, rotating,
 or flashing lights.

3 (c-1) In addition to the blue oscillating, rotating, or 4 flashing lights permitted under subsection (c), and 5 notwithstanding subsection (a), a vehicle operated by a 6 voluntary firefighter may be equipped with flashing white 7 headlights and blue grill lights, which may be used only in 8 responding to an emergency call.

9 The use of a combination of amber and white (d) oscillating, rotating or flashing lights, whether lighted or 10 11 unlighted, is prohibited, except motor vehicles or equipment of the State of Illinois, local authorities and contractors 12 may be so equipped; furthermore, such lights shall not be 13 lighted except while such vehicles are engaged in highway 14 15 maintenance or construction operations within the limits of 16 highway construction projects.

17 (e) All oscillating, rotating or flashing lights 18 referred to in this Section shall be of sufficient intensity, 19 when illuminated, to be visible at 500 feet in normal 20 sunlight.

(f) Nothing in this Section shall prohibit a manufacturer of oscillating, rotating or flashing lights or his representative from temporarily mounting such lights on a vehicle for demonstration purposes only.

(g) Any person violating the provisions of subsections
(a), (b), (c) or (d) of this Section who without lawful
authority stops or detains or attempts to stop or detain
another person shall be guilty of a Class 4 felony.

(h) Except as provided in subsection (g) above, any
person violating the provisions of subsections (a) or (c) of
this Section shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
