19 RESOLVED, That the study include an analysis of the 20 existing electricity transmission capacity in this State, a determination of the areas of the State where additional 21 22 transmission capacity is needed, a determination of the areas of this State where additional demand for electricity may 23 feasibility of establishing a North-South 24 the occur, transmission corridor, and an estimate of the cost of 25 26 implementing the recommendations contained in the study; and be it further 27

28 RESOLVED, That the Illinois Commerce Commission, the 29 Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, and the 30 Department of Transportation report their findings and 31 recommendations to the General Assembly by October 1, 2001; 1 and be it further

2 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be delivered to 3 the Chairman of the Illinois Commerce Commission, the 4 Director of Commerce and Community Affairs, and the Secretary 5 of Transportation.
