# Message from The Adjutant General

*Dear Governor Pritzker ...*

*The Illinois Department of Military Affairs' 2022 Annual Report, as required by law, shows our state fiscal support and expenditures by county during the past fiscal year. However, behind the numbers on this report, the people of the Illinois National Guard and Illinois Department of Military Affairs have accomplished a great deal. I am honored to highlight some of our successes.*

*During the state's fiscal year 2022, the ILNG worked 26,607 mandays in support of domestic operations. The end of the state fiscal year on June 30 also marked the end of our COVID mission. The ILNG worked 837 days of continuous support of the state's COVID-19 response. This was the longest continuous domestic response mission in the Illinois National Guard's nearly 300-year history, surpassing the Great Flood of 1993.*

*In addition, in early February when we activated approximately 110 Soldiers and Airmen to assist the Illinois State Police in patrolling the highways helping stranded motorists during severe winter weather.*

*We also deployed Soldiers and Airmen to assist the state with cybersecurity for primary and general elections.*

*Not only did our Soldiers and Airmen work here in the State of Illinois but they fulfilled their federal missions in other states and abroad.*

*The 404th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade sustained operations at Camp Lemonier, Djibouti, with nearly 200 Soldiers while our Security Forces Assistance Brigade deployed Soldiers to Mongolia and the Philippines on train and assist missions. The 1744th Transportation Company mobilized more than 120 Soldiers and Bravo Co., 1st Battalion, 376th Aviation sent another 40 Soldiers to support the federal mission on the Southwest Border. The 709th Medical Company Area Support deployed nearly 60 Soldiers to Kuwait and Iraq. Charlie Co., 260th Military Intelligence sent Soldiers to support U.S. military operations in Kosovo. The 126th Air Refueling Wing deployed about 110 Airmen to support U.S. military operations in the Middle East and Africa.*

*Through our nearly 30-year State Partnership Program with Poland, we stepped up the number of training teams sent to Poland to help build the capabilities desperately needed as their neighbor, Ukraine, fights for their sovereignty against Russia's unprovoked and illegal invasion. These training teams have helped with critical capabilities including anti-armor weaponry and medical assistance. Illinois National Guard equipment and arms have also gone to support Ukraine.*



*Back in Illinois, the ILNG and DMA have continued to change the lives of our state's youth through Lincoln's Challenge Academy. The program graduated more than 150 cadets and continues to have a major impact across the state.*

*The state's fiscal year 2022 was busy. Our service members performed exceptionally well while fulfilling our missions at home and abroad, and we have improved our professional and tactical skills to be ready for future missions. I am proud to lead such a world class organization and the extraordinary men and women who serve our great State and Country.*

Headquartered at Camp Lincoln in Springfield, the Illinois Department of Military Affairs is the state agency responsible for the daily administration of all matters relating to the Illinois National Guard.

The Illinois National Guard, a joint Army and Air Force organization, operates under the Illinois Department of Military Affairs and is commanded by The Adjutant General, a two-star general appointed by the Governor.

The Illinois Army National Guard is approximately 10,000 strong, while the Illinois Air National Guard comprises about 3,100, for a combined strength of 13,100 members. Under Department of Defense plans, the Illinois National Guard stands shoulder-to-shoulder with the active duty components in providing our nation's defense capability.

The Illinois Army National Guard maintains 49 readiness centers (48 state-owned and one federally licensed), three joint armed forces reserve centers, one state headquarters facility, one military education facility, one military museum, two outdoor weapons range complexes, two training areas, three Army Aviation Support Facilities and 24 vehicle maintenance facilities in 49 communities throughout the state. The Illinois Air National Guard maintains large bases at two civilian airports and one active U.S. Air Force Base.

The Illinois Department of Military Affairs, headquartered at Camp Lincoln in Springfield, is responsible for all matters relating to the Illinois National Guard. As a department of state government, DMAIL oversees and manages the daily operations of the Illinois National Guard and its related activities.

The department became a part of the executive branch of state government July 8, 1957, as currently stipulated by the Illinois Compiled Statutes, Chapter 20, Act 1805. The department is the official channel of communication between the federal government and the State of Illinois on all matters relating to the Illinois National Guard.

State funding is under the supervision of the Comptroller Division of the department. Federal appropriations are supervised by the U.S. Property and Fiscal Officer for Illinois. The department brings in significant federal dollars to the state through personnel, equipment and training support funds for operations, training exercises and assigned missions.



The National Guard is unique from other Reserve components because of its dual mission. Not only is the Guard a vital part of the Defense Department's "total force" concept, it is also a key resource available to the Governor with an ongoing state mission. When natural disaster, civil disturbance or other state emergency strikes, the Illinois Guard is trained and ready to respond.

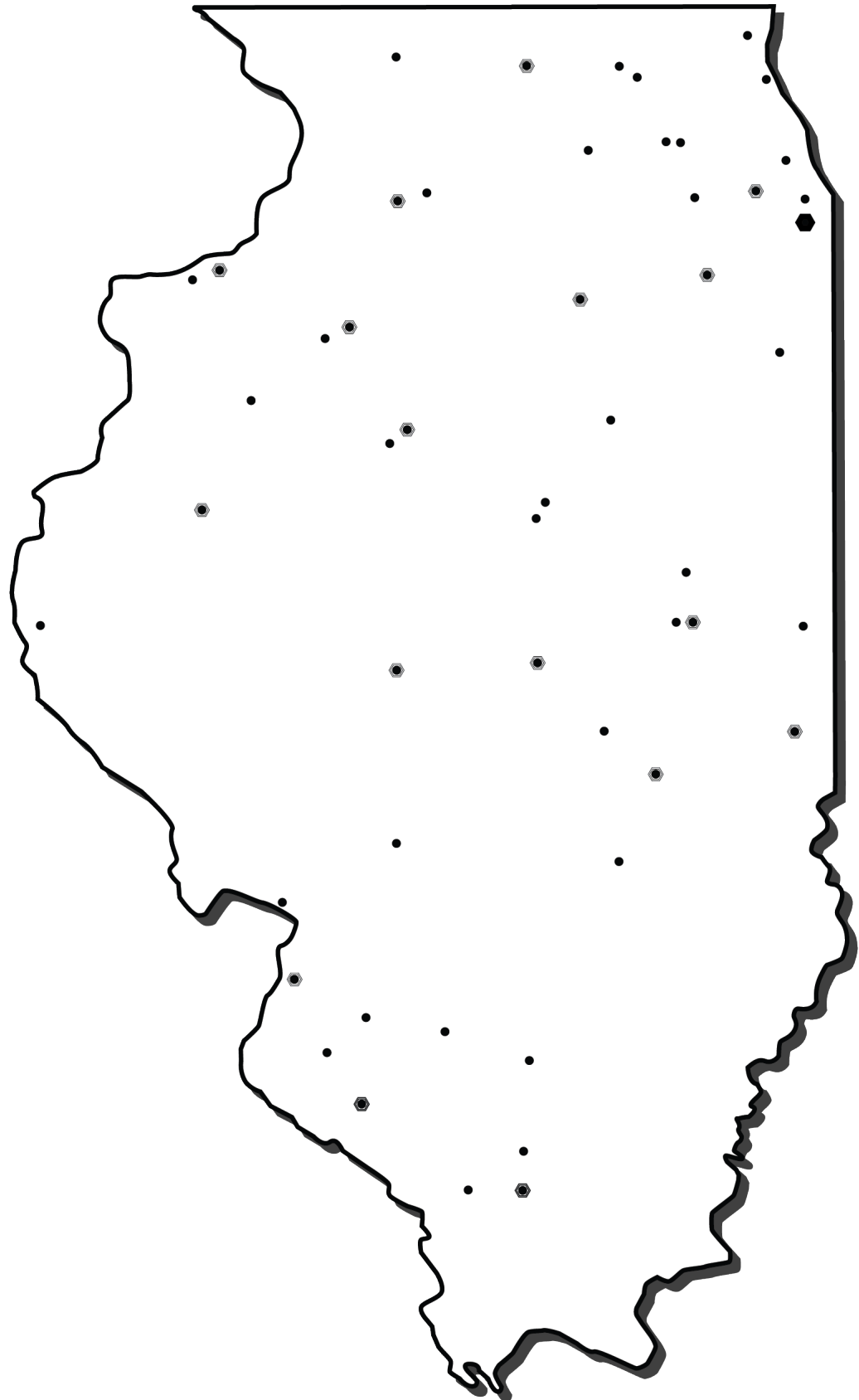
