STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE MANDATE

This document was prepared by the Illinois State Police (ISP) and is submitted to the Illinois General Assembly pursuant to 725 ILCS 5/108A-11(c) of the Illinois Compiled Statues. Please contact the ISP Electronic Criminal Surveillance Officer (ECSO) program coordinator, Division of Criminal Investigation, if you require further information.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Of the 102 Illinois counties, 55 filed their 2022 eavesdropping report with the ISP. Twenty-nine of the counties reported no eavesdrops were applied for in their jurisdiction. The following page lists the counties reporting no applications, as well as those failing to file a report. The statute requires each state's attorney to file a report with the ISP; however, 47 counties failed to file a report by the given deadline. Historically, several counties do not submit their report or fail to submit it before the deadline.

The report shows a total of 185 eavesdrop applications were submitted in 2022. Of these, 172 were original applications and 13 were extensions. The below list depicts the types of crimes investigated utilizing eavesdrops:




2022 CONSENSUAL EAVESDROPS TYPES OF ORDERS


