SUBJECT: Comprehensive Personal Health and Safety and Sexual Health Education Survey Report, 2022-23 School

Year

The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) respectfully submits this report to fulfill the requirements set forth in <u>Public</u> Act 102-0522 and Section 27-9.1a (i) of the School Code, which state the following:

The State Board of Education shall, through existing reporting mechanisms if available, direct each school district to identify the following:

- (1) if instruction on comprehensive personal health and safety and comprehensive sexual health education is provided;
- (2) whether the instruction was provided by a teacher in the school, a consultant, or a community group or organization and specify the name of the outside consultant, community group, or organization;
- (3) the number of students receiving instruction;
- (4) the number of students excused from instruction; and
- (5) the duration of instruction.

ISBE must report the results of this inquiry to the General Assembly annually, for a period of five years beginning August 20, 2022.

Comprehensive Personal Health and Safety and Sexual Health Education Survey Report

School Year 2022-23



Foreword

Public Act 102-0522, effective August 20, 2023, created the Comprehensive Personal Health and Safety and Sexual Health Education Act and required the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) to adopt the National Sex Education Standards as the Illinois Learning Standards for sexual health education. These new standards went into effect on July 13, 2022, within 23 Ill. Admin. Code 1.APPENDIX D.

PA 102-0522 requires ISBE to collect information about sexual health education instruction in Illinois. A short survey was developed for this purpose and sent to all school districts, Regional Offices of Education, and Intermediate Service Centers on May 24, 2023. This report is a compilation of data collected from this survey.

Background

PA 102-0522 allows school districts the option to provide sexual health education instruction. Should a school district choose to provide such instruction, parents/guardians may opt their children out of such instruction. School districts that choose to provide instruction in sexual health education must develop or select a curriculum that is aligned with the National Sex Education Standards. The survey that this report documents provides data about these options and requirements. The survey will be administered again in each of the next three school years.

Methodology

Collection instruments and procedures used by ISBE to collect data on sexual health education instruction follow the requirements outlined in PA 102-0522. The school year (SY) 2022-23 data collection was conducted using the same survey questions as SY 2021-22, with an updated survey methodology. For SY 2022-23, an electronic survey form was issued to school districts, Regional Offices of Education, and Intermediate Service Centers in a web-based application called Survey Builder, which is housed within the ISBE Web Application Security (IWAS) system. This method was selected because Survey Builder in IWAS prevents duplicate answers and provides a clear report of all entries. This year's survey was released on May 24, 2023, and closed on July 21, 2023.

Limitations

The enforcement of the reporting requirement of <u>PA 102-0522</u> is subject to a few limitations, including, but not limited to:

- The ability of school districts, Regional Offices of Education, and Intermediate Service Centers to receive the communications about the survey's availability in the IWAS system and complete the answers within the allotted time frame.
- The SY 2022-23 survey had one small error that may have impacted reporting.
 The survey asked entities to report the duration of instruction "as a decimal to
 the nearest quarter hour." The survey was set, however, to collect duration in
 whole numbers. Entities had to round any duration entries they had formatted
 in decimals to whole numbers. This error will be corrected in future iterations
 of this survey.

School Year 2022-23 Results
