In accordance with the Unified Code of Corrections, Acting Director Latoya Hughes respectfully submits the following data regarding the peerled Civics course administered at all correctional facilities.

The CY23 figures are a representation of participants and completers per Public Act 101-0441 effective January 1, 2020. All individuals exiting an IDOC facility are offered the Civics handbook containing course information prior to their release. It should be noted that individuals have the right to decline taking the course and/or receiving the handbook.

For the time period represented in this report; January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023; there were 17,711 individuals that exited IDOC. Of those exits, 1,988 individuals were enrolled in the Civics course and 1,754 individuals had completed the course, 11,660 individuals were given the Civics handbook prior to their release.

Sec. 40. Voter and civic education program monitoring enforcement.

(b) Compliance with this Act shall be monitored by a report published annually by the Department. The reports must include:

- (A) the number of re-entering citizens who enrolled in the program,
- (B) the number of re-entering citizens who completed the program,
- (C) the total numbers of individuals discharged segregated by institution.

Note: Work camps and Joliet In-Patient Treatment Center are recorded under their parent facilities.

¹ All individuals exiting IDOC are offered the civics handbook. The Department acknowledges the distribution of civics handbooks is much higher than what is reflected in the official numbers. This is a result of the manual effort required to input data into the tracking system of record. Training of staff for data entry of the civics variables in the tracking system of record is ongoing. Numbers of handbooks received and course enrollees/completers will increase and be more reflective of our efforts in future reports.

² Discharge refers to any individual who was released from an IDOC facility and is no longer under state supervision.

³ MSR refers to any individual who was released from an IDOC facility who is under parole supervision.

⁴ Exit refers to all individuals who were released from an IDOC facility including those that are under supervision and those who are discharged.
