Dear President Cullerton and Speaker Madigan:

Public Act 94-0614, the Mercury-Free Vaccine Act, became effective January 1, 2006 and was amended on January 28, 2008 to provide that “no person shall be vaccinated with a vaccine or injected with any product that contains, or prior to dilution, had contained as an additive, any mercury based product, whether as a preservative or trace amount levels.” This Act requires vaccines to be mercury-free but provides in the statute a process by which the Department can evaluate and assess the needs of Illinois citizens to have access to vaccines.

Section 10, paragraph (3), requires that upon issuing an exemption, the Illinois Department of Public Health shall, within 48 hours, notify the legislature about any exemption and about the Department’s findings justifying the exemption approval. The Illinois Department of Public Health hereby notifies the General Assembly that it has filed a statewide Declaration of Exemption on behalf the public and private health care providers for the following vaccines, known to currently contain trace or greater amounts of mercury-based products, and therefore affected by the act: Tetanus and Diphtheria toxoids (Td) and Influenza Vaccine for the 2019-2020 season in multi-dose formulations. The Declaration of Exemption and requisite justifications are attached for your information.


